Tips on looking of Judges

The composition of the Judges is to be an ODD number of 'gender'

EG: 1 male / 2 females or 1 female / 2 males

You **must** have an odd number of Judges (4 Judges is *NOT* permitted).

As they are still the national sponsors, one Judge should be from the National Australia Bank – please advise me in writing of any issues raised with obtaining a NAB Judge.

Judges can only judge at *ONE* Final per YOTY year – so if they are a judge for you at your Club level, they cannot be a judge for another Club or at another Final in the same year.

Judges *CANNOT* be: (a) Lions - (inc Honorary Lions, Privileged Lions and Affiliate members), Lionesses or Leos, (b) not staff members of Contestants' schools; and (c) not otherwise associated with Contestants.

If in doubt – please just give me a call.

WINNERS KEEN TO PAY IT FORWARD 3 DECEMBER 2014

The Lions Club of Ormeau has received an early Christmas present after winning \$5,000 in Pimpama Junction Shopping Centre's My Community Rocks competition. The club is already looking for ways they can 'pay it forward' and share their winnings to help more local community groups get ahead in the New Year. The Pimpama Junction My Community Rocks competition saw shoppers place tokens in barrels over the past six weeks to vote for their favourite community organisation to share in \$10,000 worth of cash.

Eight community groups, including schools, sporting clubs and community organisations entered the competition, with Ormeau Lions Club taking top prize, followed by Coomera Early Learning Centre (\$2,500), with Pimpama State School and State Secondary College receiving \$1250 each. Ormeau Lions Club president Margaret O'Neill said winning the competition was a great surprise, and she was now looking to find ways to give back to the locals who had supported the club over many years. "We were thrilled to see that we had so much support from the community, so our plan is to spread the money around so that other groups in Pimpama and Ormeau can set themselves up for a great start to 2015," she said.

"We are now calling for applications from groups who think they could put the money to good use - if they can demonstrate they have a worthy cause which will benefit a wide variety of local residents then we are happy to support it. "I applaud Pimpama Junction Shopping Centre for taking the initiative to host this community-minded competition - it really shows that locals are willing to support each other and give back to improve the community they live in."

The My Community Rocks competition winner was crowned at a family fun day, which included a range of activities such as face painting, a sausage sizzle and live entertainment. Managing Director of Tipalea Partners - which owns Pimpama Junction - Scott Spanton said the fun day was a great success, with hundreds of families attending. "It was a great way to kick off the festive season - especially with the winner of My Community Rocks showing true Christmas spirit of sharing and giving to others," he said.





Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc 2013. Region Marlborough Rating 94/100. Awards 2 trophies 4 gold. This Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc 2013 was already New Zealand's Champion savvy. Under its original label it won the prestigious trophy for 'Champion Commercial White Wine' at the New Zealand International Wine Show 2013 (New Zealand's largest wine competition). At that show, this wine walked all over the much pricier, big name sauvignon blancs such as Giesen The Brothers, Nautilus Estate, Villa Maria Reserve Wairau Valley and Giesen The August. Prior to being recognised as New Zealand's top commercial white wine, it had already confirmed its credentials by winning gold medals at the Marlborough Wine Show 2013 and at the International Aromatic Wine Competition 2013. Not that we needed more convincing, but (under its own label) it has just won the trophy for 'Best Sauvignon Blanc' at the International Cool Climate Wine Show 2014. Clearly, the constant stream of awards for the wine reinforces the fact that this savvy is a spectacular bargain. Show judges from near and far have had their say, and they just keep handing it trophies. By any standards it is absolutely a 'cut above' the vast majority of Marlborough sauvignon blancs and is a great buy so if you're a savvy lover this one is for you.

Mount Barker Sauvignon Blanc 2013. Region Mount Barker Rating 94/100 "Elegant, tightly focused Western Australian". Light straw-green; a near-perfect example of the huge gulf between the high-toned Marlborough sauvignon blanc style and the more elegant, tightly focused Western Australia expression; here citrus, gooseberry, herb and mineral drive an intense and long palate, the aftertaste fresh and breezy. Alcohol: 13%. Date tasted: Sep 2013. Drink by: 2015. Rating: 94/100. James Halliday, Australian Wine Companion, November 2013.

Reserve Tasmanian Chardonnay 2013. Region Northern Tasmania Rating 95/100. A smooth, graceful chardonnay sourced from the East Coast and Tamar Valley regions of Tasmania. Fresh aromas of citrus, stone fruit and melon with a touch of flint and spice. Ripe, composed flavours of tangy nectarine, white peach and grapefruit with a gentle creaminess. The long finish is highlighted by bright crunchy acidity and subtle mineral texture.



Research The most Important Element You've never Heard of You will be horrified when you read the results of your research.

Anyone who has been to Taronga or Melbourne Zoo recently, will know about the campaign to save gorilla habitat by asking people to recycle their mobile phones. Gorilla habitat in the Democratic Republic of Congo is being cleared to mine for coltan, a metal used in mobile phones and other electronic goods.



People are becoming more aware of the source of their minerals, and more willing to boycott those with dubious origins.

Australian zoos are campaigning on coltan. Melbourne Zoo

Columbite-tantalite — coltan for short is used to create surface acoustic wave filters, devices used in mobile phones and televisions to improve audio quality. The average mobile phone has about 40 milligrams of tantalum inside — not a considerable amount, but one that adds up quickly thanks to the millions and millions of mobile phones in use. P.T.O.

Tantalum capacitors experience an extremely low failure rate, making them perfect for use in medical equipment, including hearing aids and devices that you don't want to randomly fail, like pacemakers. Tantalum is not harmed by bodily fluids, and does not irritate the flesh of the implantee, making it a perfect metal from which to create hip, knee, and other orthopedic implants.





Pisplaying the Australian National Flag

Whether the flag is displayed flat against a surface (either horizontally or vertically), on a staff, on a flag rope, or suspended vertically in the middle of a street, the canton should be in the uppermost left quarter as viewed by a person facing the flag. In the case of the Australian National Flag, the Union Jack should be seen in the top left quarter of the flag.

Even when the flag is displayed vertically, this rule must be followed, although to the casual observer the flag appears to be back to front. The reason for this is that the canton is the position of honour on the flag.

When the Australian National Flag is displayed alone on a speaker's platform, it should be flat against the wall or on a staff on the right of the speaker as he or she faces the audience.
