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# *Welcome everybody to an Extra Greeedy Year.*

Lions,

It is extremely gratifying to me to see so much evidence that Lions in Q1 really have heart – lots of it.

This was brought home to me after District Governor visits to our clubs recently.

I was at Brisbane Moorooka club a couple of weeks ago and was informed of the imminent conclusion of a club project to supply two water purification systems that will provide clean water for the first time ever for thirty villages in Central Sri Lanka. In conjunction with a humanitarian grant from LCIF, they were able to raise the matching funds with a couple of thousand over and the equipment is currently being installed and commissioned as we speak. Warren Loos from the club will be going to Sri Lanka for the opening, which will hopefully be performed by the President of Sri Lanka, Maithripala Sirisena, in early November.

Moorooka Lions club isn't the biggest club in our District but they can be justifiably proud of their efforts in their community, both locally and internationally.

Another visit I would like to mention was to Brisbane Pinelands a week before our District Convention.

They informed me that they were helping a local identity to send aid to farmers in the far west of Queensland to a triangular area between St George, Bollon and Charleville. Although Charleville is in Q3 district, most of the area being serviced by this activity lies within about 40% of our Q1 district area. The task has now become too much for the gentleman and Pinelands are taking the project over (they have been assisting him for the past couple of years with storage, transport and collection). They have been taking out aid packages to the farmers, made up from donations received at local shopping centres around their area. Each of the farms they visit, they leave three or four boxes – one of basic hygiene items and some cosmetics for the ladies, a box of toys for the kids, and a box or two of non perishables foodstuffs. They also take cash money with them to buy food vouchers from local shopkeepers, who are doing it just as tough as the farmers, and giving them to the farmers as well. This cash injection is very important, because if the shopkeepers leave they will likely never return, further delaying any future recovery of the area.

Please send any donations that you wish to make to Brisbane Pinelands Lions Club, and just mark "drought" on the back of the cheque.

This project, which they have called the City to Country project, moved me greatly and at my own club, Kingscliff, the following night our members agreed to send a \$1000 donation straightaway to Pinelands.

At short notice, I allowed Pinelands to set up a table at the convention so they could take donations.

With support from Nigel Jeny, our special guest from LCIF, who identified \$20,000 sitting unused in an account in Townsville, they raised a magnificent \$30,500 for the Country to City project by closing time on the Sunday. Well done Q1 Lions – you have Heart – lots of it!

This is a great result Lions, and I have been notified of several thousand more dollars contributed since then.

If you want to make a private donation (and I sincerely thank the three individuals who have given \$3000 so far), I urge you to contact PDG Rob Johnson from the ALF, who will process your donation through the foundation to give you tax deductibility.

Please also bear in mind that this effort will need to continue until a solution for the massive problem these farmers are involved in occurs. It may be flooding rains, or some humanitarian project of government or other philanthropy, but at least our efforts are letting them know they are not alone, and restoring some small amount of dignity to them – Lions with heart are there and will be as long as the problem lasts.

Finally – what a cracker of a convention at Stanthorpe!

I know DG's tend to wax lyrical about THEIR convention, but I have been listening to Lions who were there and they have all given it an enthusiastic thumbs up!

Very well done Stanthorpe Lions Club, and your zone helpers. It will be a very hard act to follow but try we will.

Next year is in Kingscliff, and our early EARLY registration form is elsewhere in this newsletter. We had a draw at the convention and an accommodation package is going to a Goondiwindi Lion, there is one more to be drawn from all PAID early earlybird registrations received by 1st December this year (\$105 early earlybird hospitality pack price).

## Lismore Lions Fountain

As many of you will know, Lions of Australia gave a fountain to the people of Lismore in 1967 to celebrate the birthplace of our organisation there 20 years previously.

The fountain, which is located on the western end of the Lismore Civic Centre, has since been refurbished a couple of times and was turned off by Lismore City Council nearly three years ago. It is now in a quite degraded condition, parts are missing and vandals have all but destroyed the fountain jets, and smashed light fittings etc.

A motion was passed at a Q1 cabinet meeting last year to allow LCC (Lismore City Council) to demolish the fountain and replace it with a public artwork by renowned local artist Scott Harrower, who was to depict the history of Lions in Australia with mosaics on six sandstone seating blocks. The bronze plaques attached to the fountain were to be relocated to the sides of the blocks or attached to the wall of the adjacent Civic Centre.

This issue laid dormant until this year when Nancy Casson, newly installed President of Lismore City Lions Club took up a campaign to force LCC to recognise the extent of local opposition to this plan. Over the next few months a public campaign to "Save Our Fountain" managed to get the LCC to reconsider their position based largely on their misjudgement of the extent of local opposition to the plan to demolish it.

Following a discussion I had with the Mayor of Lismore City, Jenny Dowell, a compromise was negotiated which will see the Fountain saved from demolition.

We will agree to hand over to the Council the entire balance of our District Fountain account (approximately \$67,000). In return LCC will agree to properly place the Fountain on their Public Assets Register, restore it to full operational status, and maintain it properly with no further funding required from Lions - ever.

As a further part of this agreement they will also install the public artwork on concrete seating bases around the fountain with the story of Lions in Australia from Lion Bill Tresise onward. We will confirm these arrangements shortly with an exchange of letters under our respective letterheads.

There is still work to be done to get all of this in place, and a LCC meeting in November to ratify the compromise, but we are confident it will take place as negotiated.

People have asked me how I feel about this outcome.

I have to confess that I am a water junkie at heart – I love waterfalls, cascades, bubbling brooks and fountains. I still work in the water industry, as I have most of my life.

It has been difficult for me, inheriting the cabinet decision from last year, and having to move forward with it – but I admit that the proposed public artwork would give a better representation of our history than the fountain could – despite it being an icon of Lions in that area.

I congratulate Nancy and the Lions of Lismore and surrounding districts for their efforts. Although it seemed counter-intuitive at the time, it actually helped us to achieve the result we all wanted.

This outcome is a win for all – for the people of Lismore, for Lions, and for me personally.

A motion to rescind the fountain demolition motion will be tabled at our next cabinet meeting in November.

There are numerous other innovative outlets for these mini cakes, which can be sold all year long, not just at Christmas.

With our larger cakes and the puddings, just a reminder to make sure you check the "best before dates" and cycle the older ones for sale first.

Our District Governor Peter reminded me again that he is still looking forward to that 10% increase in sales this year so hope you are keeping that in mind when ordering.

# Postage Stamps Help Children To Walk

Since 2005 the Lions International Stamp Club (LISC) has been collecting used stamps and unwanted collections from clubs and individuals in Australia and overseas and selling them to raise funds for the Australian Lions Children's Mobility Foundation. (ALCMF)

Year after year, kilo after kilo, collection after collection the search goes on. Yet many clubs and individual Lions still don't know of this project.

At the recent Australian Lions convention in Newcastle, a cheque for a record \$9200 was handed over representing the results of stamp sales over the previous 12 months.

This brings the total since 2005 to almost \$40,000. The club handles in excess of 300 kilos of clipped stamps every year and each year the project grows a little larger as more and more clubs and individuals join in.

The money donated is used to purchase walking frames for children born with cerebral palsy.

Stamp Club Australian secretary Ross Paine co-ordinates the project. "We ask people sending stamps to clip around the stamp leaving no less than an eighth of an inch and no more than a quarter of an inch of paper. Not too close and not too much paper either. Every stamp donated is sent to auction and every cent raised is passed on to ALCMF. "We ask that the stamps are clipped neatly as the buyers purchase by the kilo and they will not bid on a lot if they see too much paper left around the stamps, and unfortunately we just don't have the time to clip any more stamps after we do the ones we obtain ourselves."

We will also happily accept unwanted collections, first day covers, post office packs etc and sort these for the auctions. "We recently sold the donated collection from a deceased estate and received almost \$1000 towards the project," said Ross.

## Pinelands Lions Heritage Listed Hall

The heritage listed hall belonging to the Lions Club of Brisbane-Pinelands is the 3 times a month venue for both Board and Dinner meetings.

A large array of Community Groups including play groups, dancing groups and church groups use the hall daily at subsidised rental. Through Lions these subsidies have, over the years, provided thousands of dollars for Community activities.

The Pinelands Hall as it is now known came about when the Runcorn Progress Association disbanded in 1978 passing the ownership of then Runcorn Progress Hall over to the Lions. At that time our Club was just over 1 year old. With the hall being in a state of disrepair this lead to the Council, to call for discussions about the demolition of our hall, from these discussions with council, Lions undertook to erect a toilet block and carry out urgently needed repairs to save the hall from demolition.

Over the years as funds were raised work has been carried out on the roof, ceiling, rewiring, hot water system, kitchen and appliances, replacement stairs front and back and much much more including the development of the grounds that are also used for out door wedding. Every year our beautiful wooden floor receives specialist treatment, and repairs and maintenance are ongoing. Now this once dilapidated hall built in 1926 “the ere of the Model T Ford”, a wonderful piece of local history is still serving the locals community, close to 90 years later. Pinelands Lions is proud to be the custodian of this iconic hall.
