

# EDITORIAL



The Lions of our District need to look closely at their clubs and try to consider what is not working and why it is not working. One could ask, "Does my membership fulfill my expectations?" If it doesn't then one could easily resign, but this is not a real alternative for a real Lion. The question we should ask ourselves is, **"What do we have to change to develop our club so that it does fulfil all of our expectations?"**

CHANGE is the chance of innovation, novelty, and new opportunities. Some people, however, see change as threatening rather than exciting. The attraction of change is related to the driving forces of goal achievement, survival, profitability and fulfilment of members' needs. CHANGE MANAGEMENT is concerned with keeping the organization in tune with the community, with other service organizations and with its members. THE MYSTERY OF CHANGE is generated because quite often, when we are involved in significant organizational change programs, we are not quite sure what the eventual outcomes will be for the organization and for ourselves. Another aspect of the mystery is to understand why sometimes we succeed and why sometimes we fail.

Lions could consider the benefits of promoting themselves as "A Key Members' Club" where all members actively promoted Lionism and introduces a new member into their club as soon as possible. This way, the work load is more equitably distributed without overloading the willing few. Lions could seek out areas that could be changed to make their club more attractive to members so that members will be more amenable to fulfilling their commitment to attendance at meetings and projects. Some areas of change that might be considered are: Membership, communications, participation, program, activities and projects.

**All members should reject negative attitudes and be positive in word, thought and action. It is through associating with Lions with a positive commitment to service and fellowship that we can become more positive in our own selves and thus become more effective in reaching our goals.**

Many corporations, sports teams and organizations with talented individuals have never become winning groups because they can't live together, work together or win together. In the end success comes when people work successfully with people. There is nothing as powerful and contagious as positive, uplifting enthusiasm that is handled wisely by a group of people who respect one another and contribute their individual talents and abilities coming together as one united force to reach one common cause, goal or dream.

It is amazing what Lions can do when they work together. Working together willingly for a common purpose can lead to the accomplishment of seemingly impossible tasks. Have you asked 'What if' lately? What if we tried it this way? What if we changed that procedure? What if I changed my attitude? WHAT IF?

**Problems stimulate creativity. Creativity leads to solutions. Solutions lead to change. Change leads to challenge and growth. Lions, let's be creative. Stand back and look at our club with a new perspective. Give it a different twist. For 2016-2017, let's do a common thing uncommonly well!**

## CHRISTMAS CAKES

Lion Don reported another year of growth with cake sales throughout the District. Total sales for 2014 was 44,369, and last year 2015 total was 45,261. Lion Don would like to remind clubs that the small individually wrapped cakes are good profit earners @ 100% margin and are easy to sell to cafes, travel/booking agents, mobile coffee carts etc. They are easy for resellers as the cakes do not require any special storage, PLUS you sell a whole box at once and they don't have any Christmas branding on them.

## CONVENTION 2016 KINGSCLIFF

DG Peter advised that arrangements are continuing at a fast rate, including good donations for the expenses of the Convention which has meant the budget re-adjustment. The registration forms are now available along with the Exhibitor forms for those Cabinet officers who wish to have a booth at the Convention, and early application will be necessary due to the limited space available as well as limited power sources.



At the moment the early bird cost to members we believe will be \$80- while the cost will be \$95- for the full Hospitality book. The revised budget will be presented at the July Cabinet Meeting.

## CARRARA LIONS GRANT NEW TRIKE TO BROOKE

All 12-year old Brooke Langeveld wanted was a tricycle so that she could go riding with the rest of her family. For Brooke, a bicycle was out of the question as Down Syndrome has affected her balance.

The family had tried all kinds of modifications to bicycles but the only answer proved to be a trike especially designed for older children but the cost meant buying it was out of the question. But Brooke's dream became a reality when Carrara Lions donated a new trike.

**In an aim to help those in need in the community, Carrara Lions Club recently launched a new Small Grants Program,** inviting people to apply for up to \$1,000 for life-changing equipment or support that can't be funded from other sources.

Club President, Roxanne Scott said that the response from the community has been very touching. "Successful applicants also include a lovely young man with multiple disabilities including autism, endocrine issues, low vision and a rare growth disorder", Roxanne said. "But he is known for his beautiful singing voice, often performing at local markets. His dream is to record a CD and the Club grant of \$1000 will help him achieve that milestone."

Roxanne said that a second Downs Syndrome will receive a \$1000 grant as she was selected for the swimming team representing Australia at the Downs Syndrome Trisome Games in Italy later this year and needs the funds for travel costs.

## “COLOURFUL KNEE RUG” PROJECT.

At the recent Lions Convention at Echuca, Victoria, the **Lioness Club of Palm Beach Currumbin** won the Fonnies Tresise Premier Project Award for the 3rd time in 7 years.

This Award is named after the wife of Lions Australia founder William Tresise, recognising outstanding humanitarian service.

**“Colourful Knee Rug” project.**

**Purpose:** to utilise the skill, time and giving spirit of our members talented in crochet/knitting to benefit our aged Community by providing colourful knee rugs to residents of local Aged Care Homes.

**Benefits:** direct benefit to our aged Community. Producing 600 practical hand crocheted knee rugs. Fostering Community ties with local Aged Care and support services.

**Final results:** an ongoing project which brings not only a warm rug, but a colourful possession that is appreciated by recipients and welcomed by Aged Care organisations providing residents with a sense of individuality and worth.

The “wool” used is actually 8 ply acrylic yarn, chosen to withstand washing by the heavy industrial washing machines used in Aged Care Homes.

Each rug requires 10 balls of 8 ply acrylic yarn – a \$20.00 outlay. Lionesses have spent \$12,000.00 of their own money for this project!!

The Lioness Club of Palm Beach Currumbin meets on the first Wednesday of each month at 1.00 pm at the Lions Den in Murtha Drive Elanora – followed by afternoon tea.

## THE LIONS WANT YOUR STAMPS

The Australian Chapter of Lions International Stamp Club (LISC) is always looking for postage stamps for their major fund raising used stamp project. No matter how big or how small, they are seeking used and unused postage stamps, unwanted collections, first day covers, old postage labels, post office packs – in fact anything connected with philately.

Everything that is donated to them is sold and every cent is passed on to the Australian Lions Childrens' Mobility Foundation to be used to purchase walking frames for children born with cerebral palsy. The secretary of the Australian Chapter, Lion Ross Paine said "the biggest items donated each year are Australian and foreign stamps that have been clipped from envelopes leaving an edge of about 3mm (1/8") around the stamp – we receive approximately 400 kilos of these stamps every year". The stamps are sorted into 10 kilo boxes and then sold at the NSW Philatelic Association auctions held in Sydney every 4 months and from these small envelope corners, when all put together, we can turn them into an excellent fundraiser. "In fact", he said "we turned them into \$13500 in the past 12 months and a cheque for this amount was handed over to the foundation at the Australian Lions Convention held in Echuca in May". It was a record effort on the part of the 20 Australian members of LISC and one they are keen to break again this year.



# BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

## THE FACTS

**Screening saves lives:-** The number of Australian women diagnosed with breast cancer has doubled in the last 20 years. This statistic sounds alarming, but what it really means is that more women are receiving early diagnosis and early intervention.

## THE FACTS

Detecting cancer at an early stage can result in less drastic treatment options and a greater chance of survival. So, while you're in the shower or getting dressed in front of the mirror, do a self-check. It's quick, easy and it could save your life.

## THE FACTS

**Breast Changes:-** It is important to be aware of the normal look and feel of your breasts and to report any persistent breast changes promptly. The earlier breast cancer is detected, the better the chance of long term cure.

If you experience any of these symptoms, particularly if they persist for several weeks, see your doctor as soon as possible:-

- A new lump or lumpiness, especially if it is only in one breast.
- A change in breast size or shape.
- A change to the nipple, such as crusting, ulcer, redness or inversion.
- Nipple discharge.
- A change in the skin of the breast such as redness or dimpling.
- An unusual pain that doesn't go away.

But remember, the majority of breast changes are not breast cancer.

In Australia, women over 40 are entitled to a free screening mammogram every two years through BreastScreen Australia:-

- If you are between 50-74 years of age you will receive a written reminder every two years. Women aged between 50 and 74 are most at risk of developing breast cancer, with breast cancer in this group accounting for 75 per cent of all women diagnosed.
- If you are 40-49 years of age or 75 years of age and over you are still eligible for a free screening mammogram every two years, however you will not receive a written reminder to attend.

**So in summary – “keep an eye on the girls for any changes and see your doctor” ...**


