





All Lions Clubs in Q1 (NSW included) can enter this contest.

Encourage your local school to contact the local Fire Brigade and have the Firemen come to talk to the Grade 4 students on Fire Safety in the Home. Once the Officers have talked to the students they can then prepare a poster showing how they understand what to do in case of a fire at home. The posters can be prepared on A3 size paper and have illustrations and wording to show what to do in an emergency.

More details on dates for entries to be sent in will be in advised but contacting your schools early in the year so that the contest can be put into the school curriculum is a good start.

## ALF & LCI FOUNDATIONS



Lions Clubs International  
**FOUNDATION**

The Australian Lions Foundation (ALF) was established at the Multiple District Convention at Mt Gambier in 1983. Until recently, the foundation operated under Trust Deeds which were approved by all State and Territory Attorneys-General and the Australian Taxation Office.

At the 2016 Echuca Convention, an important change was made. The foundation is now a company. This was necessary to comply with various legal requirements. One important effect is that, to be eligible to apply for a Grant from ALF, Clubs need to apply to become members of the Australian Lions Foundation Limited. Some Clubs still have to apply for membership. Therefore, I urge all Clubs to ensure that they apply for membership of the Foundation. This does not cost anything.

To fund grant applications received from Clubs around Australia, the Foundation needs to raise funds from Lions Members and Lions, Leo and Lioness Clubs. Individuals making financial donations are able to claim a tax deduction for the amount donated, as the Foundation has deductible gift recipient status. Clubs donating general moneys to the Foundation are able to recognise the work done by Members by making awards to them. ALF's awards are the Willaim R Tresise Fellow Award, the Ian M Stockdale Humanitarian Award, the James D Richardson Honour Award, and the Community Service Award.

I encourage all Members and Clubs to donate to ALF so that the Foundation is able to carry out its valuable work as the grant-making entity of Lions in Australia. I am available to assist with all grant applications and queries in general.

When considering club positions for the next Lions year, Club Members are requested to appoint an LCIF Club-Co-Ordinator. This club position was created by LCI during 2016 and appears in the list of club officers on the MyLCI website. The aim of this new position is to assist with the reporting to fellow Club members on the progress of LCIF programs such as SightFirst, Youth Quest, Measles and Disaster Relief along with the showing of informational videos and the on-line magazine "Lions Quarter".

Any Club member so appointed by his/her club would have their name and contact details recorded on MyLCI along with usual Club Officers making up part of the Board of Directors. Identification of possible projects needing LCIF Grants would also become part of the functions of this position.


