
If everyone of your members purchased a character, it would be a great start to reaching our goal! If every club matches their member's donation, we would be three quarters of the way there.

THE LIONS CLUB OF BRUNSWICK MULLUMBIMBY 'AUSTRALIA'S LONGEST CONTINUOUS SERVING LIONS'

(SUBMITTED BY PDG TONY CORNELL)

John Shirley of the Lions Club of Kyogle has 65 years' service with the one club. Lion Noel James of the Lions Club of Brunswick Mullumbimby also has 65 years' service with his club. Both these outstanding Lions are separated by about 4 months

It is not surprising that this should be so because the two clubs are in Region 1 of Q1 the Heartland of Lionism in Australia.

The Members of the Brunswick Mullumbimby Club feel it is appropriate to enlighten fellow Lions of the exploits and achievements of Lion Noel James.

Noel James was born in Mullumbimby NSW in 1928, he had three brothers. Noel and his brother Bill James formed a partnership and opened a hardware store known as James's Hardware (Now known as Mitre 10)

In 1952 James D. Richardson was about to charter the fifth Lions Club in Australia, Brunswick Mullumbimby Noel was not a Charter Member, he joined the new Club about three months after Charter. (PDG Ray Phippard was the club's secretary)

Noel became the Club President in 1959, he went on to become the President again in 1978, all Noel's brothers became members and all held the President's position.

Noel tells of some of the exploits and pursuits tackled by the handful of Lions Clubs that were chartered in the early days. One of these was the serious problem created by a law that obliged hotels and other licence premises to close at 6pm each day, drinker had to be off the premises by 6:20 pm. It was traditionally known as "The Six O'clock Swill" It's the sort of thing that could take the fun out of any Lions meeting.



James D. Richardson was the publican of the Hotel Brunswick at Brunswick Heads; the new club would meet at his hotel. It did not take long for the four other newly chartered clubs to realise that they were all less than an hours drive to the Hotel Brunswick, All five clubs, Burns Mullum, Kyogle, Murwillumbah. Lismore, Coolangatta Tweed made James Richardson's pub their meeting place. As guests of the publican and in a private room they managed to turn the 6 o'clock curfew into: Whatever o'clock.

A Pride of Lions can find answers to any problem.

These days Noel gets about on a Mobility Scooter, his eyesight is failing. He still gets to some club meetings His enthusiasm for the principles of Lions remains as strong as ever.

MESSAGE FROM DR CARLOS SALOMON

February is **Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month** and a time when the profile of ovarian cancer, its causes and cures, is highlighted across Australia.

As a Lions Medical Research Foundation Senior Research Fellow, my team and I are at the forefront of ovarian cancer research. At the Exome Biology Laboratory, we are working on how human exosomes can be isolated, characterised and what their role is in evaluating their clinical utility as biomarkers of disease and therapeutic interventions. My specific project relates to tumour-derived exosomes as a signature of ovarian cancer, and liquid biopsies as indicators of tumour progression. As Study Leader, I explore how exosomes, which are produced by cells and contain genetic material and proteins, contribute to the development of ovarian cancer.


In the past five years, the understanding of how cells communicate with each other in both healthy and diseased states has undergone a significant shift. We have learnt that by characterising the exosome profile of early stage cancer, individuals with ovarian cancer can be identified at an early stage while the disease is still treatable.

My team and I have been able to isolate extracellular vesicles and measure the level of a particular type of exosome. This means detection of early-stage ovarian cancer is possible by looking for a specific type of exosome that tests positive for tumour biomarkers. **There is an urgent need for a reliable diagnostic marker to allow for early detection of ovarian cancer, and this would improve survival rates dramatically. When the cancer is diagnosed earlier, women face a much better chance of a full recovery.**

So this February, I am asking all Lions Clubs of Queensland and Northern New South Wales to fundraise on behalf of Lions Medical Research Foundation and in support of the work my team and I are undertaking to ensure we develop cures and treatments for ovarian cancer.

Thank you for your support to date, and for your support into the future.

During the Lions Awareness Day scheduled on 3 March 2018, it is suggested Clubs perhaps consider taking this opportunity to promote Diabetes awareness.







Queensland and Northern New South Wales Lions Medical Research Foundation offers a range of awards including the Professor Ian Frazer Humanitarian Award.

Professor Ian Frazer AC was a Lions Medical Research Fellow in 1985. His research led to development of the drug Gardasil, and he is recognised as co-inventor of the technology enabling the HPV vaccines, currently used worldwide to help prevent cervical cancer. In 2016, he was recognised as Australian of the Year, and in 2013 was appointed Companion of the Order of Australia in the Queen's Birthday Honours list. Ian and his wife Caroline are committed and enduring philanthropists, who are also members of the Brisbane Inner West Lions Club.

This award is available to Lions Clubs seeking to recognise individuals who have given outstanding service to the community in support of medical research.
