ALSTONVILLE LIONS CLUB

Alstonville celebrated its **40th birthday** on the 27th January with a **THANK YOU** to the community of Alstonville for its support of the Club over the last 40 years. The celebration was held at the Plateau Bowls and Sports Club from 11.00a.m. to 3.00p.m. There were free slides, jumping castle, pantomime, magic show, face painting, snow cones and popcorn for children and adults alike. Even the cake was shared around.

The Club was chartered on 25th January, 1978 with 21 members and a further 88 have been or continue to be members over subsequent years. Over the years the Club has been actively involved in home shows, garden fairs, Show Week, Christmas Markets, New Year's Eve celebrations, Alstonville's sesquicentenary celebrations and more.

Currently the Club runs the very popular Main Street Markets and Pig Races in May, weekly cash Bingo, an annual cubby house raffle, Christmas cake sales as well as barbecues and community service for various organisations.

During this time the Club has raised in excess of \$800,000 and given more than 75,000 service hours to the community. President Les Wiles has indicated that this year's target is distributing \$40,000 to community and worthwhile projects.

In 2015 the Club was awarded the Business Community Award by the Alstonville-Wollongbar Chamber of Commerce.



LCIF CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF WONDERFUL SERVICE

Our *international* Foundation, Lions Clubs International Foundation, has been helping Lions serve their communities around the world for 50 years. To mark this milestone, various videos, photos, stories have been put on a special website: **LCIF50.org** It is worth having a look at this site to see what marvellous humanitarian assistance has been given over a half-century.

In our constitutional area, funding from LCIF has seen MD 307 (Indonesia) join the Indonesian government and GAVI, the Vaccine Alliance, in a measles and rubella (MR) immunization campaign. This two-year program is designed to provide vaccines to at least 95% of Indonesia's children between the ages of nine months and 16 years by the end of 2018. To overcome myths and misperceptions about vaccinations, local Lions are using social media, radio and meetings with school administrators, religious leaders and local government officials to give information. Vaccines are made available during school vaccination days, and at local clinics, hospitals and community centres.

Donations to LCIF by Clubs will count towards the Centennial Service Challenge. If your Club wants to earn a higher level banner patch, please resolve to add an LCIF donation to your activities for the second half of the Lions year, and do this by the middle of June. Slightly over US \$26,000 has been donated to LCIF so far this Lions year. However, we still have a fair way to go to meet our fund-raising goal for this year. As the international grant-making arm of Lions, LCIF needs the financial support of all Lions Clubs.

Please ask your Club LCIF Co-ordinator to speak to your Members about LCIF and the wonderful job it has done, and is still doing, for people less fortunate than ourselves.

The Piccadilly Olde Time Music Hall is a loving look back at theatre around the mid 1800s - Music halls can be traced back to the taverns and coffee houses around 1852 London where men and women met to eat, drink and do business.

Performers sang songs whilst the audience ate, drank and joined in the singing.

By the 1830s taverns had rooms devoted to musical clubs. They presented Saturday evening Singsongs and Free and Easies. These became so popular that entertainment was put on two or three times a week.

The taverns, saloons and supper rooms would have been noisy and difficult places in which to perform. The audiences chatted throughout the acts and could be very unruly often throwing things at the performers - bottles, old boots, even a dead cat. Industrial towns favoured hurling iron rivets.

In some halls, bottles carried by the waiters were chained to the trays and the orchestra was protected from the missiles by steel grilles stretched over the pit.

While women were not allowed in the middle-class song and supper rooms, working-class women went to the taverns. In the early days they would often accompany their husbands and bring along their children and even babies. Charles Dickens declared in disgust that the pit had become "a virtual nursery".

Songs were about married life, home, drinking, food or gardens. Patriotic songs were favourites and sentimental songs which touched the heartstrings. Many of the songs had a double entendre and were considered racey....
