

In one of the Incoming Officer Information days, an attendee raised the question of Branch Club and the relationship with the host Club. A Branch Club is basically an extended part of the parent Club and their members also members of the parent Club. However, a Branch Club holds independent meetings and runs separate projects and activities as the Club desire. When the members of a Branch Club reach 20, it would be time to consider becoming a new Club. The prime reason, as I see it, is to allow a small group of people start making a difference in their community sooner, aiming to form a Lions Club in time. Anyone wanting more information in the subject, please let me know.

## District Projects

A reminder that motions for the November 2018 Convention must be submitted in writing to the Cabinet Secretary not less than sixty (60) days prior to the date of the opening of the Convention.

## Children & Young People Policy

The District has a policy on projects dealing with children and young people. All Clubs planning 2018-19 activities involving children and young people must ensure all involved (Lions, their families and guests) adhere to relevant government legislation to the States where the Clubs are located.

# ORGANISING YOUR HANDOVER

1. Think about how it is best to do the handover. Depending on your role you may feel you need to contribute more effort in to the handover. It might be an idea to talk to your successor and find out what they know and if they have an idea of what they might want in terms of a hand over.

*In most instances you will have to at least prepare some sort of handover document.*

*Consider what the focus of your handover should be.*

2. Draw up an early outline of your handover document. Once you have a clear idea you can start by drawing up a draft handover document. This will help you to organise yourself, and catalogue all the various tasks and pieces of information that you will need to pass on during the handover. This document should include:

*Detailed information on your activities, tasks and priorities.*

*An outline of the key points of the role (A clear outline of what is expected of your successor).*

*A list of any essential files that will be handed over.*

3. Tie up loose ends. If you know you will be leaving your role soon, it can be helpful to put in a little extra work to make sure that you tie up any loose ends. You will get a sense of satisfaction at achieving this, and you will also be helping your successor start off with a clean slate. Doing this will also help ensure that you leave on excellent terms and with a good reputation.

*As much as possible, but if you have something that is nearly over the line, put in a little extra work to get it done.*

*A new person coming into a activity right when it is near the line may struggle to get it closed, because they are unfamiliar with all its intricacies.*

4. Write up a formal handover document. The final step of your handover preparation is to complete a handover document. You can build on the draft document, but try to elaborate and include all the important information. Try to have this completed and sent to your successor before they are set to start (before the shadow Cabinet meeting if possible so they can look at it and ask questions). The content will vary from role to role, but it may include some of the following:

- A list and timetable of actions.
- A calendar of forthcoming events and deadlines.
- A guide to navigating files and folders on the computer system which you may have provided.
- A briefing of ongoing issues.
- A list of useful contacts.



## REPORT ON SUPER MAX & BRYCE PROJECT AND SALES AT ACA CONFERENCE

On 3rd June 2018 three members of the Lions Club of Gold Coast Tallebudgera (Steve, Jon-Ross and Amy) and one of our St Andrews Lutheran College Leos (Mariel) attended a fundraising event for one of our newest community partners – the Super Max & Bryce project ([www.supermaxandbryce.org](http://www.supermaxandbryce.org)). The goal of the Super Max & Bryce project is to share love, hope, happiness and comfort with children in treatment for cancer and their families. They do this primarily through gifts of **Cloud b Super Max the Turtle night lights** to children in treatment – these special night lights are designed specifically for children with cancer; they can be sanitised so children can take them everywhere including even the most stringent of hospital environments like isolation wards and ICU. The project was started in late 2016 by a local nine-year old boy named Bryce from Burleigh Heads. His commitment to service at such a young age is exactly what we hope to engender and extend through our work as Lions and Leos. The 3rd June event included a presentation by Bryce and his mum, Amy (one of our Lions) to the 800+ attendees at the Australian Childcare Alliance Queensland's 2018 "Together We Grow" conference. Thanks to the truly overwhelming generosity of the conference attendees, we raised \$9,600 (\$6,100 via Club PayPal devices and card payments) in 90 minutes of selling on the day for the project through sales of Super Max & Bryce scarves, socks and donations for night lights. Amy later shared the following reflection about the day, "There aren't words for how grateful we are for everyone's warmth, generosity and support. There was something magical about watching Bryce tell his story here, knowing that everyone in the room has dedicated their lives to the health and wellbeing of children and their families. We're particularly grateful to the Executive Board of ACA QLD for inviting us, everyone who supported us with hugs, kind words, donations and purchases, and the Lions Club of Gold Coast Tallebudgera for their help and support. Today was a day we will always remember. Thank you ACA QLD members and friends. We are proud members of your village."

How much I enjoyed doing my research backed by people who believed whole-heartedly in the need for it.*


*I used to talk about the work we were doing at all 201A and 201K Conventions, and many times I talked to individual LIONS clubs. However, it occurred to me that, although I did my best to explain the research in straight-forward language, LIONS did not have a hard copy of the publications that arose from that research in my time as your research Fellow from 1966-1978.*

*So, I decided to photocopy the more important of those publications and put them together in a book as a record of the outcome of your support for our work back in those exciting days, to allow your full perusal of them . I hope this may provide something of historical significance for you and your District to keep, to show what LIONS did to get medical research rolling, not only for my work but for all the impressive subsequent achievements in medical research you have made and are making possible.*

*Therefore, if you would accept this book for your archives, it would be a great honour to me and I believe to the memory of the countless LIONS Members who made it all possible.*

## LIONSONOZ IN ACTION

The ladies of Australian Lionsonoz are becoming expert knitters. While their husbands drive their caravans and motor homes, visiting all parts of Australia, the Lions Ladies spend their time in the passenger seat enjoying the scenery and knitting for various projects.

Australian Lionsonoz have donated dozens of knitted garments and shawls to various hospitals all over the country, mainly for the new babies in the Premature Babies ward of the hospitals. They have also knitted dozens of "Trauma Teddies" to be used to sooth upset children in cases of accident, fire, family tragedies, illness, operations and any condition where children are in stress.

Lions Lady Sherril Matheson has become involved in the Sarah De Jonge project of knitting 1000 hearts while she travels with Lion John on their travels visiting towns and Lions Clubs anywhere in Australia.

This project commenced in 2016 with the aim of each participant knitting up to 1000 cottonwool filled hearts which are distributed free to people who need some comfort and a little love. The child or adult simply put the heart in their pocket and handle it when they need reassurance that somebody cares and sends their love. There are many people hurting or afraid in our community and this project does its bit to give them comfort.

The hearts are distributed free through the Facebook page "The 1000 Hearts Project" to people, both adult or children who need them. People all over the world are forming 1000 hearts groups sewing or knitting hearts and giving them away in simple acts of kindness. Their aim is to change the world, one heart at a time.

Lions Lady Sherril has knitted 47 hearts so far and looks forward to as many as she can before the end of the year, maybe even the magical 1000.

## Q1 NOW HELPING OVER 85 CHILDREN LEARN TO READ EVERY WEEK

The Q1 District currently sponsors 17 Story Dogs. This is the largest amount of dogs being sponsored by any Lions District in Australia! Well Done Q1!

A Story Dogs reading session is typically 20mins long, one-on-one with a year 2 child (7/8yr old) who can't yet read. The reading sessions happen weekly with the same children reading every week. If a child can't read, is too shy, anxious or fearful to read our wonderful volunteers will read to them. Reading a fun, colourful picture book together with a child that may never have been read to in their life is such a joy and an incredibly important function of the Story Dogs program. Story Dogs estimates that each Dog Team delivers around 200 reading sessions per year.

If they were not volunteers and being paid, this would have a price tag of over \$6000/yr/Dog Team. So your \$500/yr/Dog Team goes a long long long way!!

Making reading FUN is our serious mission!
