
Lions Stinger Research Foundation & Lion Cord Blood Foundation

This month the district will be showcasing 2 of Lions projects - Lions Stinger Research Foundation & Lion Cord Blood Foundation. Here is some information below:

Lions Stinger Foundation:

The Lions Club of North Queensland and James Cook University have been in partnership since the early 1990s when the Lions Foundation for Scientific and Medical Research on Marine Species Dangerous to Humans was founded.

The Foundation aims to better understand invenoming jellyfish and other marine stingers, so that there can be better management of human/animal interactions as well as improved preventative and curative measures to ensure that no sting is lethal.



Lions Cord Blood Foundation:

The Lions Cord Blood Foundation Inc. was initiated in 1996 by Lion Laurie Denton (deceased) a former member of the Lions Club of Waverley Inc. Managed by the Lions Club of Waverley Inc.V5. A District Project of 201V5 and since the Multiple District Convention in Queensland in 2006 the Foundation continues as a Category B Project until June 2020 when it will be reviewed.





9 Tips to Stay Safe on Social Networking Sites

Social networking sites, like Facebook, Instagram and Twitter, have become the world's largest databases of personal information. Not surprisingly, many of these sites have become a haven for identity thieves, con artists, and scammers.

So how can you stay safe and still be social?

By exercising a little common sense and taking a few precautions, you can protect yourself online without sacrificing any social interaction.

Staying Safe, Smart, and Social

1. Keep your firewall security and anti-virus software up to date.
2. Never log in from public hotspots. Most social networking sites don't have a secure login (https), so your username and password could be swiped at any time. Only log in from trusted wireless networks.
3. Use strong passwords comprised of upper and lowercase letters, numbers, and symbols.
4. Be cautious with links and files. If you're not sure about the source, don't download or click on the link. Hackers will often post links in comments to try and trick you into clicking through.
5. Remember: If you wouldn't say it or do it in public, don't post it online.
6. Keep track of what your friends post about you. We've all heard stories about people losing clients or being fired because of inappropriate online content.
7. Be careful who you follow/friend. It may feel good to have hundreds of friends, but in reality, you only know a fraction of those people.
8. Be wary of add-ons. Many games and plug-ins are written by third party companies and not the social network. Look before you leap.
9. Do a search on yourself; you may be surprised. If you feel you have too much information out there, you can always restrict your online profile.





AUSTRALIAN LIONS HEARING DOGS.

About Australian Lions Hearing Dogs:

Australian Lions Hearing Dogs is a not-for-profit organisation that procures, trains and delivers Hearing Assistance Dogs to deaf and hard of hearing people throughout Australia.

Since 1982 we have been transforming the lives of hundreds of Australians by providing independence, security and confidence, and our dogs also relieve the worry that families and friends of our recipients experience.

The dogs remain loyal companions for many years and some of our dogs have even saved lives, they've had a natural intuition to recognise that something was wrong and immediately found and alerted a person in the house to follow them back to e.g. a person having a heart attack, a baby that had stopped breathing, a neighbour on the other side of the fence that had collapsed etc. This is all over and above what they were initially trained for, they have become an important part of their owners lives and an invaluable member of the family.




Rescue Puppies.

In the past an Australian Lions Hearing Dog could be any size, shape and usually mixed breed, rarely purebred. Traditionally the majority of our dogs have been sourced from rescue organisations and pounds, where unwanted dogs are dropped off, however due to lack of space, these Centres are unable to house dogs indefinitely and not all dogs are adopted, so the Centre contacts us in the hope we may be interested in or looking for - a suitable dog or dogs for our training program.

In actual fact, we are rescuing dogs from a somewhat bleak and uncertain future, to giving them a second chance of a loving home with someone who really needs them. These rescue dogs are usually aged between 6 mths. and 3 y/o when we select them and often give 10 to 15 years devoted service.

From acquisition through to placement with a new owner the cost of an Australian Lions Hearing Dog is \$37,000 but we provide them free of charge to the owner. The cost is covered by the generous donations from the Lions Clubs across Australia who support our Annual Appeal and other Clubs and businesses etc. who arrange fundraising events during the year for our benefit..

With one in six Australians currently suffering from some form of hearing loss, there is a growing demand for our Hearing Dogs and currently our waiting list has gone out to two years which is far too long for anyone to have to wait. Therefore, in an effort to shorten the wait time for applicants we have been procuring puppies e.g. Tenterfield Terrier's, Labradoodle's, and Cocker Spaniels who are fostered with volunteers before entering the Training Program. We have also increased our Training Staff with three Cadet Trainers.

Our aim is to be able to deliver one Hearing Dog per week, but at present we are restricted with kennel space, office space, storage areas, quarantine facilities, training areas etc. What to do? The announcement was made at the MD Convention last May, for a four stage extension of our existing premises to be commenced in 2021 and completed by 2026. We are seeking Corporate funding for this project. When complete there will be kennel space for 50 dogs, air conditioning throughout - including the kennels, lots of storage space, state of the art training facilities, spacious reception area and offices, improved car parking and visitors area and a very attractive street frontage - to name a few improvements.

All good, can't wait to get it started, can't wait to see it finished.



MyLion updates as of 1/27/2020.

- **New Report Form**

Newly designed report form to streamline and speed up the entry to report an activity

- Updated reporting flows so user consistently lands in the Report Past Activity page when reporting activities
 - Configured the new form to hide/show fields to minimize what the user sees and limit to only necessary fields
 - Added the ability to upload multiple photos for an activity
 - Created new preview page for the new form
 - Streamlined metrics to clearly depict required vs optional fields based on activity type selected
 - Added Organization field to capture the organization that received donated funds of an activity
 - Removed the need to enter time and locations to an activity being reported via the new form
 - Updated Signature Activity to a checkbox on the new form
 - Display the name of the person who created the activity
 - Add Funds Donated metric to the Home page and remove People Served per Member metrics from the Home and Metrics pages
 - Updated the 'Who can see this?' field to Everyone, Club, District and Multiple District as options
 - Allow user to move between the old and new forms
- **Multiple District Administrators can now report District level activities**
 - **Deletion Rules**
Applied rules for deletion of reported activities.
 - Activity must have an end date within the current fiscal year

- Activity that ended in the immediate prior fiscal year only if deletion occurs within the 1st 15 days of the current fiscal year
 - Reporting officers can delete an activity that anyone created
 - Creators & Co-organizers can delete an activity to which they are assigned
- **Editing Rules**

 - Reporting officers can edit an activity that anyone created
 - Creators & Co-organizers can edit an activity to which they are assigned
 - **Bug Fixes / Other Features**
 - Resolved issue with the invite emails not being received by the invitees
 - Corrected the metric Trees Planted / Cared for to show on the Celebrate and Share page
 - Fixed a problem where users were not able to get to the Metrics page by clicking on the metrics section on the Home page


