## 2020 ‘VIRTUAL CONVENTION EVENT’

Clubs have already been advised by Cabinet Secretary Di McCrae that the District Convention for 2020 will not be held in a “personal attendance” or “face-to-face” format. The extraordinary circumstances forced upon all communities around the world and here in Australia by the Covid 19 pandemic, regrettably, forced this decision to be made.

It therefore becomes necessary to conduct the mandatory items of an annual convention very differently than has been the case in the past.

These mandatory items will be included in a “virtual convention event” which will be by way of a “zoom” or similar platform or, preferably, live-streamed.

As far as voting on the motions and the conducting of the secret ballots are concerned, information will be given in greater detail later when all arrangements have been finalised, but in broad terms for now, Clubs/Delegates will:

- receive the notices of motion and the information on the candidates standing for election as DG, VDG1 and VDG2 as usually occurs;
- be able to view proceedings (including the nominating speeches and the candidates’ speeches) which will be “live streamed”;
- vote on all the motions by returning a voting sheet to the Cabinet Secretary by 5pm on 27 November, but no discussion on the motions under consideration will be able to occur;



- participate in the ballot for the positions of DG, VDG1 and VDG2 by returning the secret ballot papers to the Cabinet Secretary by 5pm on 27 November;
- receive notification, from District Governor Narelle, at a suitable advertised time of the outcome of the voting and the results of the ballots after the votes and the ballot secret ballot papers have been counted.

Our District is not the only District in Australia grappling with procedures to overcome Government restrictions. We are designing the procedures outlined in general terms above so as to cater as fairly and as procedurally correct as possible. Please note that the final date for receiving motions from Clubs or for nominations for positions for the 2021-2022 year remains Monday, 7 September.

The Queensland and Northern New South Wales **Lions Medical Research Foundation** has now begun its spring appeal with the launch of its annual “Spring for Research” campaign.

The Foundation needs your help now more than ever. Its sole function is to fund medical research; that is research into illnesses and diseases that most of us would never have thought possible in our lifetime. Covid19 is a prime example. It has caused a worldwide pandemic with over 25 million people infected and researchers around the world are searching frantically for a cure.

Some examples of this are Drs (now Professors) John Healy performing the first kidney transplant at PA Hospital, Robyn Rodwell who went on to the implementation of the Cord Blood Bank at the Mater hospital, Ian Frazer and his partner Jian Zhou developing the Cervical Cancer vaccine Gardasil and many more.

# Dear Dorothy

**Q** Will the District Convention go ahead?

**A** Due to the most recent wave of Covid-19 and further restrictions, a decision had to be made and unfortunately the Convention in its present form cannot continue and had to be cancelled. Please ensure that you read our CBL report further on in the newsletter for details on the voting process.

**Q** When will my club find out if our application for hardship has been approved?

**A** The District Governor must have received all applications by Friday 21st August. They are to be assessed by the District Governor with a recommendation put forward to Multiple District for final assessment and decision. The decision time will be decided by the number of applications received.

**Q** When do the Notices of Motion have to be in by?

**A** All notices of motion must be in with the Cabinet Secretary by 7th September 2020.

**Q** Will there be any club visits in NSW?

**A** All face to face visits out of Queensland have been postponed until 2021. Visits via Zoom or other telecommunication systems are available. Please contact your Cab Sec for details.

**Q** Is Youth of the Year proceeding?

**A** There are certainly plans for this to proceed. A meeting with all of the District Governors and Youth of the Year Chairs is scheduled this week, to discuss and deliberate. Barbara Clifford (YOTY Chair) will advise clubs as soon as details have been finalised.

**Q** Will Q1 be starting any new clubs this year?

**A** The District Governor's goal was to open 1 full club and 1 branch club during 2020-2021 year, but that goal was set prior COVID. Her goal has not changed and thinking positive is her plan of attack.

## CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS – MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES



Following the article in last month's Newsletter, I have received queries from Clubs asking how a Club Member is placed into the "Member At Large" category.

This membership category exists mainly for Members who find themselves unable to regularly attend Club meetings and activities and who wish to remain Lions. A Club Member in this situation should advise the Club in writing that, for some reason, regular attendance is not possible and make a request to be placed into the "Member At Large" category by the Club's Board of Directors.

At a Board Meeting, the Club's directors should consider the request and either approve or not approve the request. The applicant Member should then be notified of the outcome of the request.

If an application from a Member to be placed into the "At Large" category is approved by the Board, the Secretary should notify the Member accordingly, also stating the situation will be reviewed after 6 months has elapsed. The Secretary should also adjust the Member's details on the MyLCI site.

Common misconceptions regarding this membership category include a Member just

saying he/she is "going Member at Large", that the category only lasts for 6 months and an "At Large" Member does not have to pay membership dues during the period of "At Large". There has to be an application/approval process (as described above) and membership in the category has to be "reviewed" officially by the Board each six months (either to continue or cease membership in such category). It is advisable for everything to be in writing (email is sufficient) so that a paper trail exists. Full dues are still to be paid during the time a Member is "At Large".

Another more common category used by Clubs is to confer "life membership" status on a Member. A Club desiring to do this recommends to Lions Clubs International that the Member be granted "life membership" status and makes a payment to the Association of the Australian dollar equivalent of USD 650. The monthly exchange rate determined by LCI should be used when making this payment. A Lion who is granted "life membership" then no longer pays International dues but must still pay MD, District and Club dues.

## LIONS 'CARING FOR OUR ELDERLY'



## LIONS 'LAP THE MAP' FOR DIABETES

**It is back !! – on Saturday 14th November, 2020**

All Clubs in our District (and around Australia) are encouraged to participate in a National Day of Action to support World Diabetes Day (WDD) and to conduct an activity or project that promotes a healthy lifestyle and improve education awareness about Diabetes.

There are many things you can do to raise awareness and involve the community, but most of all we need you to count your Km's. We need to count how many Km's we do in our District which will be added to the National tally – the goal is to increase the total that Lions walked last year. **Easy !!**

There is nothing against Clubs raising funds for Diabetes Awareness at the same time, but the aim of the day is to promote Diabetes Awareness.



**Idea just for you:** Why not approach your local Gym, and ask to collaborate with them by having their members (that will be doing exercise on that day anyway) volunteer to sign up to participate in the Lap the Map, and then every km that they walk or run on the treadmill will count to the Lions Lap the Map for Diabetes challenge. PTO...





Print off some Certificates of Participation / Appreciation (which I will provide to registered / participating Clubs), and everyone that walks Km's for the Lap the Map gets a Certificate. Ask the Gym for space to have a table with some Lions and Diabetes Awareness materials. Make sure that you have a Lion present as well, so that you can do the Certificates straight away and also to chat about Lions. This is a great way to promote the Lions Lap the Map for Diabetes – and not a huge effort for Lions (just a visit before the day to arrange, and then some Lions on the day).

## MEASURING SERVICE IMPACT FOR LIONS: ‘THE IMPORTANCE TO REPORT’

When we share our stories and report our impact, we unify our organisation, inspire our communities and capture the attention of a global audience.

**Service Activities:** these are the hands-on work that we do to help the community. Service activities are defined in two ways : “direct “ service and “indirect” service.

Direct Service – Lions plan & implement a service to serve community needs and they interact directly with the people being served, *EG: school breakfast program or Diabetes screening.*

Indirect Service – Lions serve but do not interact directly with beneficiaries, *EG: canned foods collection for local food pantry, homeless collections (as Lions don't see the recipients).*

**Fundraising Activities:** these are the activities we do directly raising monies to then help the community / or raising funds to enable our service. These are activities that Clubs do to be able to raise the much needed funds. *EG: rattling the tins/buckets, merchandising Lions goods like cakes & mints, sausage sizzles and even high teas.*

Service Activity differs from a Fundraiser? – “a service project is a hands on project that helps a person, group or organisation for a specific cause – and a fundraiser is an activity that is to raise funds to then later help the community”.

**Importance to Report** – it is vital that all Clubs report their Service & Fundraising Activities on MyLion – why you ask? : sharing our impact is important to members, clubs and Lions as a whole. It allows all Lions around the world to see how local service adds up to make a huge global impact. It helps chart our progress as Lions and tell our story to potential partners. It shows how and where Lions are making a difference in the community and in the world.

Please make sure that your Club enters all your activities on MyLion. If you are having troubles, and need a “walk through” to help you out, please contact me and I can do it with you over the phone.



**NOTE:** following a query that was received, contact was made with Lions Clubs International (LCI) in the USA, and they have advised that for reporting purposes, BBQs at Bunnings and the sale of Christmas Cakes etc are to be reported as a Fundraising Activity and NOT as a Service Activity – because you are selling food to raise monies to then donate to help the community and you do not know how many people that Fundraising activity will help – so the people served is an unknown quantity. It is not “per sausage or cake sold” as they are not the people helped in the community, they are the customers that helped raise the funds, not the recipient of the funds.

**District Q1 – please, let's have 100% of Clubs reporting activities on MyLion.**


