

CONTINUING JOURNEY GOOD DAY EVERYONE.

Continuing journey - and what a journey it is. What a roller coaster ride we are all on at this present time. Borders open; borders closed, restricted numbers; non restricted numbers, numbers in a house, numbers in a hall, numbers in a venue, groups in a park. It is so confusing a lot of people are simply deciding to stay home and not worry about trying to work it out.

I am pleased to advise that as of this day the borders have been shifted further south and so our northern NSW clubs can now be visited by the District Governor team. We will be in touch with each of our NSW clubs to reschedule to a date that suits.

Following on from my last report, we must still be on the lookout for those in need. There are a lot of people doing it tough out there and those who shout the loudest are not always the ones in need. Often you find that pride takes precedence and the ones who are suffering most often are the ones you would least expect. I have heard from a fellow District Governor that the suicide rate in Victoria is immense and that is something that we do not always here on the media. So please take care guys – and watch out for others.

Thank you to all those clubs who have taken it upon themselves to work by distributing food packs to the homeless, providing face masks, pamper packs and goodwill to those in need. I was most touched when visiting Inglewood Lions Club recently to find that they bring elderly residents to their club meetings and provide them with a hot meal and some company – well done Inglewood.

There has been a lot of uncertainty about the running or not running of the 2020 Q1 District Convention. A decision was made by the Executive in late August to cancel the main event due to too many uncertainties. An event of this

magnitude was too risky to continue with the fluctuating numbers and the changing of restrictions on an almost daily basis. The borders were closed disallowing the entry of interstate guests and speakers and



most importantly Lions members were restricted to either not being able to cross into Queensland or not be able to attend due to number restrictions. As devastating as it was, the decision had to be made and the hard call was put to me at that meeting. I would like to personally thank the committee from the Lions Club of Brisbane Chinese who had been working with me from July last year and to the Executive and members who have helped along the way. Everyone had so much enthusiasm and it is a great disappointment that this event had to be cancelled.

The Lions Clubs International Constitution states that an Annual General Meeting must be held each year, and that meeting will be held virtually and live streamed on Saturday 7th November 2020 from the venue previously booked for the main event. Numbers are restricted and therefore only those required to be there for the live streaming will be in attendance. Lions Club members will be invited to attend via Zoom platform which will run in three sessions allowing members to tune in on all three sessions or only the session they prefer to attend. The program will be divided into three and all the business conducted will be contained in one session (session 2). The other two sessions will be virtual opening ceremony, guest speakers and our Remembrance Ceremony. This one-day virtual event will also be recorded so members can replay at their leisure. Details on voting will be sent through to clubs by Cabinet Secretary Di with concise instructions. All voting is confidential and required within 21 days after the event.

My sympathies go to those clubs who have been suffering financially and to those who are managing to pull through the hard times. With clubs unable to meet and fundraise internally a strain has been placed on several club's Administration Accounts. Some clubs rely heavily on subsidising their member's membership dues to hold them as a member, and the lack of this funding has caused undue hardship.

I am pleased to advise that of the eight hardship applications submitted to Multiple District from District Q1, seven of them were approved. Multiple

District CEO Rob Oerlemans has contacted each of those clubs.

Please look after yourselves, look after each other and be safe.

Clubs should check their mailboxes over the next 2 weeks as I will be posting the District Governor Elect, 1st VDG and 2nd VDG Voting Papers to all clubs in District 201Q1 via Australia Post. Please ensure that you open the envelope immediately and check the contents. A reminder that voting papers received after 27th November will not be eligible to be counted, please vote as soon after the 7th November and please allow extra time for Australia Post to sort and deliver the papers back to me. Please remember this is YOUR District 201Q1 and YOUR AGM, so please Vote. I am not sure of the final number of delegates

entitled to vote, but it will be around 160 delegates for our District if all clubs cast their votes.

Many clubs have contacted me over the past couple of weeks advising that they could not access MyLCI to complete their monthly reports, I have checked the system this morning and the problem has been fixed, if you still cannot access MyLCI, please email me and I will assist.

Our District Membership on 30th September was 1584, at 1st July we had 1564 members, over the past 3 months we have added 63 members, with 43 members being dropped or transferred.

If your club has a new member to induct, please contact the District GMT Chair, PDG Ken Wilcox as he has a large supply of new member kits, this will save clubs going online and ordering from the Newcastle Office. Please ensure that you provide sufficient notice to PDG Kent re the date of Inducting the new member, you can also contact me via email, and I will pass the request onto PDG Kent.



- Has a decision been made regarding the holding of Q1 District Convention?
- A The District Convention will now be held as a "One Day" virtual event. The event will be both live streamed and recorded. There will be three sessions enabling members to log into all three sessions or choose. Due to Covid-19 social distancing and the Covid plan for the venue, restrictions are placed on attendance. Only persons required to be there for the live streaming will be in attendance in person.
- **Q** When will my club find out if our application for hardship has been approved?
- A The Council of Governors met and the decisions were made. Rob Oerlemans CEO Lions Clubs International Head Office in Newcastle has notified each of the clubs of the decisions and how and when the money is to be distributed.
- **Q** Will there be a Remembrance Ceremony?

- A Yes; there will be a virtual Remembrance Ceremony in Session 3 of the program. Clubs who have submitted a person to be remembered will be sent a recording of the presentation to enable them to do their own presentation to family members at a suitable date. Those clubs will be notified.
- Why do I have to submit a web monthly membership report (WMMR)?
- A Submitting a monthly membership report to Lions Clubs International is mandatory from each club and district globally. If your club does not submit them then your Cabinet Secretary has to do so on your behalf and that's not fair.

- **Q** Is Tyro going ahead?
- A cash back to clubs has been suggested by the company and is under negotiation. No decisions have been made at this time.

The **ALCCRF** and the **LMRF** are pleased to be represented on the Q1 District Board at the behest of Director General Narelle Parkins. Both organizations have an important role in raising awareness and continuing to focus on the important work that medical researchers do in combating disease.

In this past month, covid has continued to impact on fundraising for the ALCCRF. However, although this takes us outside our district, the ALCCRF would like to promote that the Melbourne NextGen Lions Club have launched an online fundraising effort to raise awareness and funds for childhood cancer research.

Continuing further afield, the Telethon Kids Institute (TKI) in Perth, WA, held a teleconference with the ALCCRF board in July 2020 updating us on terrific research into childhood sarcomas. Sarcomas are aggressive bone and soft tissue cancers which have a high mortality and the TKI are researching the role of immunotherapy in treating these cancers. This represents a pivot from their current immunotherapy research into childhood brain cancers, melanoma and leukemia.

More locally, the Biggest BBQ event has been ongoing, with many clubs not just raising funds, but securing additional raffle items from their local Bunnings to hold further fundraising events later in the year. This is particularly exceptional given the ongoing covid restrictions and some early issues that many clubs had with holding any BBQs at all!! With other fundraising events limited, particularly with the cancellation of the in-person component of the district convention, items such

as ALCCRF aprons and pens can be purchased online from

Supplies of ALCCRF Christmas pins are limited this year, so please check availability with either Wayne or Sophia.

The LMRF has launched its "Spring for Research" campaign, which last year raised over \$20,000 to go towards research in gestational diabetes. As part of Spring for Research, Dr Olivia Holland (Fellow) and Dr Grace Lai (Board Member) will be available for short presentations on the LMRF's work. Dr Holland and Dr Lai recently participated in the Bunnings BBQ held by the Lions Tallabudgera (her home club).

October is also the prep for next month's "Lap The Map". Out of the Q1 meetings, Jenny Maguire District Chair of GST, suggested approaching local gyms or clubs who might have running machines to aid in raising the awareness for Diabetes and the need for exercise.

This has never been more important in this time COVID-19 has these areas and the funding severely threatened and yet the conditions that they address including childhood cancer, ovarian cancer and diabetes research continue to play in our society.

We are grateful for the support of our fellow Lions and both Dr Wayne Ng and Dr Grace Lai are available for club tours and visits in COVID-19 safe compliant way.

AUSTRALIAN LIONS HEARING DOGS. 40TH ANNIVERSARY. 1980 - 2020.

This year would have been a memorable year in South Australia, the Lions Multiple District Convention was booked to be held in Adelaide. But, 2020 was very significant for another very special reason, the Australian Lions Hearing Dogs Centre was celebrating "40 Years" of training and delivering Hearing Assistance Dogs to the Deaf and Hard of Hearing people of Australia, therefore what better way than to coincide our celebrations with the Multiple District Convention.

With Lions & partners from all over Australia and beyond arriving in Adelaide for Convention, we had the perfect opportunity of showcasing our Hearing Dog program and Training Centre to the Conventioneers.

Guided tours of the Training Centre were included each day in the partner's tours, our CEO David Horne was to address Conventioneers on the Opening day, plus our Convention Display

Stand was set for an eye-catching display with Trainers and Hearing Dogs, Foster Puppies with their Carers plus plenty of our merchandise and the launch of our 2021 Calendar – which is always released at MD Convention.

On Saturday Night the Gala Dinner, provided us our chance to celebrate together, so several tables were booked to accommodate Staff, Volunteers and attending Board Members.

We were so sure that this Convention in Adelaide was going to be the one to remember.

It was - but not for what we expected it to be remembered for.

Just weeks prior to the Convention, the whole world turned topsy-turvy. Suddenly our world as we had known it had changed. All events, meetings etc. cancelled. Confusion and uncertainty was all around us, as our respective State Governments implemented restrictions and lockdowns, attempting to combat the spread of the Covid19 virus. A dreadful time was upon us.

But Lions are resilient, they don't like to sit doing nothing, and neither do the Management



and staff at the Hearing Dogs Centre. So with the staff practicing social distancing it's been "business as usual" & Dog deliveries only to South Australia, Western Australia, & Queensland. Deliveries to Eastern States ceased because of locked borders, although we have several ready and waiting to go to NSW and Victoria. Currently 20 dogs are in training and all need to be exercised, fed, cared for, etc., nine puppies are in "Foster Care" (private homes around Adelaide till they are about 8 months old).

Our Goal is to deliver 30 dogs for this year, and to mid October we have delivered 23. We will beat last year's record of 23.

The shop is a place where local community members can donate and off load their unwanted clothes, shoes, electrical, household items, small pieces of furniture and other


The items are then sold for a very low and affordable price that then provides another service to the local

LIONS PLEASE REPORT YOUR ACTIVITIES

Request – Clubs PLEASE, please report your activities / what you've been up to onto MyLion. Up to writing this article, there have only been 112 service activities / fundraisers entered (not counting meetings) – so we really need to enter them all. If you could PLEASE arrange for your service activities to be entered as a priority.

If you are having trouble entering them onto MyLion, or you don't know how to enter them, give me a call and I can go through it with you (I can walk you through it while you are online).

How do you enter BBQ's (inc Bunnings BBQs) and
 Lions Christmas Cake Sales ? – are they a Service Activity
 OR a Fundraising Activity ?? ·····

Answer – they are NOT to be entered as a Service Activity as they are a Fundraiser.

We have had the following response received direct from the Service Dept of Lions Clubs International (LCI) in Chicago, USA –

I have inquired your scenarios to our Service dept, and here is their answer:

By the looks of both of these scenarios, they are fundraisers rather than service activities. It appears that they are selling food to raise money for their club or a project. So, my advice would be that this be reported as a fundraiser and the amount of money raised be reported. In these cases, I would not report a number of people served, as it is not known how many people the food saes will be helping.

The number of sausages sold, is not the number of people helped in the end – "people served" in the reporting system, is not how many



people bought the item (like the sausage), but rather how many people were helped as a result of – which is how many people are served. For example, if the sausage sales were to help one individual in need, the number of people served for the day would be 1 – and it is recorded as a fundraiser stating the dollars raised, and one person being served (helped).

Your Club's Bunnings BBQs and Christmas Cake Sales are entered into MyLion as Fundraising Activities - because you are selling food to raise monies, to then donate to help the community and you do not know how many people that Fundraising activity will help — so the people served is an unknown quantity. It is not "per sausage or cake sold" as they are not the people helped in the community, they are the customers that helped raise the funds, not the recipient of the funds.

A Service Activity differs from a Fundraising Activity?

- a service activity is a hands on project that directly helps a person, group or organisation for a specific cause right now
- a fundraising activity is an activity that is selling something to raise funds now and to then later help the community

JAMES D RICHARDSON



Many Lions have been presented with a James D Richardson Award but many newer Lions are not aware of the Big Man, and sad to say not too many of our older Lions have had the pleasure of meeting Jim or listening to his presentations.

LION Jim was a successful business man, a hotel keeper and company director. Jim served with the RAAF as a heavy bomber pilot with 4 ½ years service in Europe, the Middle East and South East Asia.

Lion Jim was a Charter Member and was the Charter President (1952-53) of the Brunswick-Mullumbimby Lions Club.


James D Richardson BEM 1910 - 1987

Jim Richardson was one of the most beloved and respected members of Lions in the formative years of the Association in Australia. He served in the Royal Australian Air Force during the 1939-45 World War before establishing himself in the Brunswick - Mullumbimby area of New South Wales. Jim was second District Governor to be elected in Australia in 1956-57 and the first Australian to serve as a Director on the International Board of Directors in 1958. He was recognised internationally for his magnificent oratory which held people spellbound at conventions and gathering of Lions. The growth of new clubs during his year as District Governor, fifty two, was never approached again by any District Governor.

The demands he placed upon himself meant that he travelled enormous distances by road, so that he could visit all his Clubs, attend to Association and other business, as well as run his hotel with the great support of his wife Pam. The strains caused him to have a Cerebral Thrombosis whilst attending, the International Board meeting in New Orleans in 1959. He recovered after a long convalescence, but without his capacity to speak.

He was never again capable of carrying on a conversation or making a speech but continued to work for Lions at club level and attend conventions. James D Richardson BEM was one of the most dedicated and respected early leaders of Lions in Australia. In recognition of him being our first Australian International Director, the Australian Lions Foundation has instituted the James D Richardson honour award in return for a donation of \$500.00 to the Foundation. Multiple Richardson Awards may be presented to a person, club or organisation.

All Awards can be granted more than once to the same individual.
