President Alexander is a retired vice president for J.P. Morgan Chase Bank.

A member of the Brooklyn Bedford Stuyvesant Lions Club since 1984, he has held many offices within the association, including club president, zone chair, region chair, vice district governor, district governor, cabinet secretary, cabinet treasurer and DGE group leader. He also served as a Lions Eye Bank transporter, a member of the District and Multiple District PDG Association, a trustee of the New York State and Bermuda Lions Foundation, and was appointed as the Lions representative to UNICEF-New York from 2012-2014. He has served on the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum Planning and Host Committees and

has been a presenter at several USA/Canada Forums.

In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards including the club Lion of the Year, Club President's Award, the Robert J. Uplinger Service Award, several District Governor Appreciation Awards, and the Multiple District Membership Growth Award.

He is also the recipient of numerous International President's Certificates of Appreciation, seven International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is a Dr. Franklin G. Mason Fellow, a W. P. Woods Fellow and a progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

Making many trips to the airport, picking up families whose homes had been blown away and took them to pre-arranged billet houses where they could be looked after and safe.

In 1974 the floods swamped Brisbane, the meeting hall became the store house for donated clothes and household goods. They also organised 50 new wardrobes funded by Lions and built at the then custom made furniture shop owned by Nev Billeau.

Fundraising initiatives increased. Projects included sausage sizzles, meat raffles, lucky numbers, Devonshire Teas and the famous Lions Christmas cakes. The fundraising helped many people and organisations. Two major achievements were in 1977 the funding for Meals on Wheels building,

and in 1980 a Girl Guides hut was built.


Capalaba Lions donated to families going through hardship, children with special needs, scholarships for high school students, donations to Sail-ability for the purchase of boats to give children and young adults with disability the opportunity to sail,

## TREASURER'S TRAVAILS

Hi everyone,

I hope that that the new Lions year will be a rewarding time for all of you. My name is Bruce Mellor and I am the

incoming Cabinet Treasurer. Over the past 20 years, I have been treasurer multiple times in two different Clubs and been on Cabinet 6 times previously, 4 of those as Zone Chairperson.

The last time I was Cab Treasurer was in 2005/06. Much has changed since those days. Email was in its infancy and electronic transfer of funds (EFT) was unheard of within Lions. All payments were made by cheque and the post office box was cleared daily.

Today, Club Treasurers no longer need to wait until the mail is received to pay the dues accounts. For the LCI dues, I would encourage each of you to login to myLCI and download your dues statement (if you are having difficulty doing this, perhaps your Club Secretary can help you with this. If you get desperate, contact me on the below email/phone numbers). I encourage you not to wait for the mailed copy of the invoice as this will almost certainly mean that your payment will not be in the same month as the invoice and you will be subject to exchange rate variations. If you are paying your LCI dues by EFT please pay it to the District Admin A/c (details below) using your Club number, top left hand corner of invoice, as the reference. Depending on the exchange rate, the LCI dues will be about \$30.00 per member.

I would also encourage you to send all international payments to me (International Dues, International Club Supplies, Life Membership, Melvin Jones Fellowship, LCIF Donation, Other US dollar payments (please specify)). I have a deposit sheet to transfer payments directly to the LCI bank account. Please do **NOT** send monies direct to Oak Brook.

For the MD and District dues, I will be emailing accounts to your Club email address over the next two weeks. Payment will be due in mid-August. MD dues will be \$22.90 (up 20 cents) per member and District dues will be \$11.00 (no increase) per member. There will be the usual bevy of insurances and other levies some of which are per member and some per Club. Also some will be payable out of your Community/Activities A/c. It is most important that the Admin Dues are paid into the District Admin A/c and that the Community items are paid into the District Community Account. Please don't be the Club(s) that does a single cheque or EFT payment. Again, please use your Club id as the reference (top right hand corner of the invoice).

## ADMINISTRATIVE REMINDERS TO CLUB BOARDS

DG Nicole and I plan to issue reminders to Clubs on a regular basis throughout the 2021-2022 year. The items noted will not be an exhaustive list of tasks that Club Boards need to address at various times during the year, will be quite succinct and expressed only in general terms. However, this article is longer because of the importance of its contents.

In this July edition of DG Nicole's newsletter, we would like to remind Clubs that now is the time for the Board (especially the Treasurer) to begin arrangements for the financial statements for the 2020-2021 Lions year to be prepared so that the Auditor or approved Certifier can be given all accounts, receipts, Meeting Minutes and statements as soon as possible. Any changes to bank account signatories also should be done as soon as possible along with updating Internet banking arrangements. The Treasurer should ensure all Members are invoiced for their Club dues if this has not been done prior to the 30 June. Taking this action now will ensure that all LCI, MD and District dues can be paid by the due dates.

At the first Board meeting of the new Lions year, the Policy Minutes of the Club should be reviewed and ratified. At this time, consideration should also be given to reviewing the Constitution to ensure that it is current and in accordance with Lions Clubs International's and any State legislative requirements. If your Club has an ABN (Australian Business Number) it will have a "public officer" listed with the ATO. The identity of this person should be checked and the ATO advised if a change needs to be made.

Clubs that are incorporated under State legislation are required to hold an AGM. As this cannot be held until

the certified Financial Statements for the 2020 – 2021 year have been received, the AGM is generally held around September. Queensland legislation requires that, if the Secretary, President or Treasurer change, then Queensland Fair Trading department needs to be advised within one month. Use Associations Incorporation Form 10a.

Similarly, NSW Fair Trading requires that, if the Public Officer changes, then the change needs to be made within 28 days of the change. Use NSW Fair Trading Form A9.

These requirements would apply to almost all Incorporated Lions Clubs because the tenure of Club Board members finishes on 30 June each year, several months before a Club can hold its AGM and subsequently submit the annual returns to the relevant State Fair Trading departments.

Finally, check that the monthly membership reports to LCI are done on MyLCI by 20th July. This is one obligation of chartered Lions Clubs.

The Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer and I are readily available and willing to help Club Officers with any problems. Please don't hesitate to call Cab Sec Di on 0499 604 516, Cab Treasurer Bruce on 0404 035 884 or me on 0412 285 618.





## CLOSURE OF OZCLUBHOUSE

As advised in previous newsletters Multiple District informed all clubs, on the 1st of July 2021 that Multiple


District will cease to actively maintain the OZClubHouse system. The existing sites and data will remain, and the club and district sites will continue to operate.

#### **UPDATE - 22 JUNE 2021**

Over the last two weeks there have been issues logging into to the OZClubHouse sites.

This issue is actively being worked on by the technical team.

The Executive Office sent the following email to CabSec's on 22 June.





#### **CRITICAL DATES**

- After 1 July 2021, there will be no updates to the 'password-protected' area and this means your new members won't be able to access this content. Existing members will be able to access the content until 31 December 2021.
- After 1 January 2022, the password-protected area will no longer be accessible.
- After 30 June 2022, the site will no longer be supported. Any coding issues will not be fixed.
- On 30 June 2023, the Oz-Clubhouse system will be deleted.

This current issue highlights how important it is for clubs that use the OZClubHouse system to look for an alternative web site platform ASAP.

There are a number of alternatives out there and I am happy to discuss options with any club that has any queries.

I am preparing a document that outlines the various options available to clubs and this will be circulated to club secretaries in the near future.

Nominated at the club level, the Kindness Matters Service Award is a challenge for Lions and Leos to develop exceptionally innovative and creative service projects with the aim of leaving a positive impact in their communities.

#### Award Criteria:

For clubs to be eligible, they must be in active status, have completed a service project within a global cause area in the previous fiscal year and have reported it in MyLion® or their official regional reporting system.

Use the following criteria to determine if a service project could be considered for this award. Did the project:

- · Benefit one of our five global causes (diabetes, the environment, vision, childhood cancer or hunger)
- Demonstrate innovation
- · Achieve impact of scale and long-term sustainability
- Develop local partnerships
- Use local Lions/Leo or Lions Clubs International resources


#### **How to be Nominated**:
