I wish to thank IPDG Nicole and her cabinet for their service and welcome the new executive, cabinet and club officers to their year and opportunity to grow in service.


Therese and I have returned from the International

Together We Can To accomplish big things, "we all have to pull together, roll up our sleeves and put in the work to make the impossible possible".





National Diabetes
Week is the time to
raise awareness of
the challenges
people with type 1
diabetes are often
faced with.

Keeping blood glucose levels within a normal range can be difficult to achieve for people with type 1 diabetes. Aside from food and exercise, many factors beyond our control can also affect BGL, such as weather, stress, illness, hormones, lack of sleep and dehydration. Mentally this can be a lot to deal with and can impact how a person is able to manage their diabetes, ultimately affecting their physical and emotional health. This is the foundation Australian Lions Hearing Dogs' Diabetic Alert Dog Program was built on: to assist those affected physically and emotionally by type 1 diabetes.

It goes without saying that having a dog by one's side comes with love and companionship, a constant support for mental health. But ALHD's Diabetic Alert Dogs are also outstanding in their trained ability to utilise their sense of smell to alert to a change in a person's blood glucose levels.

Type 1 diabetes is an auto-immune condition where the body cannot produce sufficient insulin to regulate blood glucose levels. The onset of this condition is common in childhood and there is currently no cure. Low blood glucose, also known as hypoglycaemia, occurs when the level of glucose in your blood drops below what is considered healthy for the individual, leading to seizures, coma and even result in fatality if not treated. Dogs can detect an upcoming hypoglycaemic event before the onset of symptoms. These dogs will be especially helpful for the 25% of people with type 1 diabetes who experience hypoglycaemic unawareness, which is the failure to sense a significant fall in blood glucose below normal levels. Because of this, Diabetic Alert Dogs act as a reliable safety net, ensuring quick response to administering medications or sugar sources to stabilize blood glucose levels. They are trained to support their future recipients, responding to fluctuating blood glucose levels, retrieving a Hypokit, as well as triggering emergency alarms for help if the situation turns dire.

Prototype Medical Alert Dogs are currently in training, with our first Diabetic Alert Dog, Sal, predicted to be placed with her recipient in late 2022. ALHD's program is still being developed and will be polished and fully implemented alongside the completion of the Training Centre expansion. Australian Lions Medical Alert Dogs can be identified with their green lead and jacket, which clearly shows the role of the dog and the program's status as an initiative of Lions Clubs across Australia.

Register in **MyLCI** (https://account.lionsclubs.org/) today! As an officer, you will receive important information like updated billing statements and have access to your club's roster to make updates. It also allows you to keep your meeting information current.

Once you are in MyLion, the "Lions Learning Centre" has a plethora of Courses & Learning Paths that you can complete to improve your "skillset" (your Toolbox) * see below how to find the Content Library in MyLion* including:



- Select the "MyLion" icon up the top left hand corner
- Select the "learn" icon (the 5th icon, it will be an icon that is an open book with an arrow on it)
- Select: Lions Learning Centre "GO"
- Select "Content Library" on the left hand side and a list of all courses & learning paths will come up.

The ALF purpose is to provide help and

assistance for public relief, emergency aid and community welfare for persons in necessitous circumstances in Australia. The Foundation provides financial assistance and support, in times of Disasters/Emergencies and for Community Welfare Projects.

After Cyclone Tracy demolished most of Darwin in December 1974, in the period 1975 to 1976, Lions Australia formed two bodies —

- Australian Lions Community Emergency Relief Fund ("ALCERF") to co-ordinate fundraising for disaster relief;
- And a National Disaster Committee

In 1980 the Disaster Committee was amalgamated into the Emergency Relief Fund.

The Foundation was formed in 1981 by the District Governors of the day and this was formalised at the Multiple District Convention of Lions at Mt. Gambier in 1983.




Since 2002, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) has partnered with Johnson & Johnson Vision to implement the largest-known, school-based eye health program, Sight for Kids. The program mobilizes Lions and eye care professionals to provide comprehensive eye health services in low-income schools, currently in seven locations throughout the world; Thailand, Philippines, Kerala, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Florida, and Kenya. The program provides teachers with training to deliver eye health education, perform a visual acuity test, and screen for common eye conditions. Students identified with potential vision impairment or eye ailments are referred to healthcare providers for evaluation.

This program has created tremendous impact in communities worldwide. Today, LCIF and our partners at Johnson & Johnson Vision have proudly achieved multiple successes, including:

- 42 million students screened around the world
- 3 million students reached annually
- 500 thousand pairs of eyeglasses provided to children in need

Kindness Matters Service Award Rules

This prestigious award is given annually to a handful of Lions and Leo clubs for performing an outstanding service project in one of our global cause areas. Nominated at the club level, the Kindness Matters Service Award is a challenge for Lions and Leos to develop exceptionally innovative and creative service projects with the aim of leaving a positive impact in their communities.

Award Criteria:

For clubs to be eligible, they must be in active status, have completed a service project within a global cause area in the previous fiscal year and have reported it in MyLion or their official regional reporting system.

Use the following criteria to determine if a service project could be considered for this award.

DID THE PROJECT:

- Address needs within global causes: diabetes, environment, vision, childhood cancer, hunger, disaster relief, youth, humanitarian
- Demonstrate creativity and innovation
- Achieve impact of scale and long-term sustainability
- · Elevate the Lions brand

Timeline:

All nominations must be submitted electronically.

The following deadlines are guiding deadlines to help the nomination process at the local level.

- 1st July: Nominations are open.
- 15th August: Deadline for club service chairpersons to electronically send one nomination to the district global services (District GST) coordinator.
- 15th September: Deadline for District GST coordinator to electronically send one nomination to the multiple district global service team (MD GST) coordinator.
- 31st October: Deadline for MD GST coordinator to send one Lions and/or one Leo nomination to Lions International.





Nomination Form Rules

- The Service project description answers must be no longer than 200 words per question and must be submitted as a supplemental document typewritten in black ink and double spaced.
- The remaining sections of the nomination form must be typewritten in black ink.
- Endorsement signatures can be typewritten in black ink.
- Each nomination form must be submitted with all the sections complete with all appropriate endorsements included. Nomination forms submitted without completed information and/or the proper endorsements will be disqualified.

- Multiple districts may submit one Lions club and one Leo club nomination per year.
- Lions club and Leo club nominations should be submitted separately.
- A minimum of three of the 30 awards will be awarded to Leo clubs.

Taking the pain out of semiannual dues

There is one thing that Lions are rightly proud of – we pay our own way! Unlike many voluntary organisations, Lions members do not use publicly donated funds to cover operational costs. Every member pays fees from their own pocket to cover the administration at club, district, national and international level.

This means we can confidently tell the public:

'100% of your donated funds goes to our humanitarian causes.'

Spreading the cost

Lions members are diverse. We are working people, young people, retirees and pensioners all contributing to the valuable work of our clubs. We recognise that it may be harder for some of our members to meet the cost of dues every six months, particularly if there are other costs to manage, like club dinners.

Of course, the cost of dues is usually less than \$5 per week, so why not 'spread the load'. With the agreement of the club Board and Treasurer, why not let your members pay on a periodic basis?

You can do this by either:

- Encouraging members to "direct deposit" on a periodic basis, or
- Setting up a "Direct Debit" through a third-party company or your bank.

If your members were to set up a direct deposit of \$10 per fortnight (or an amount that will cover your club fees) into your administration fund, this will cover the cost of dues. This benefits the members and the club.

For the member, it spreads the cost into manageable amounts. For the Club Treasurer, it means that they won't have to chase members for dues ever again. It also means that if a member resigns, they will have paid their dues up until the date of resignation.

There is, of course, some additional book-keeping work that will need to be considered

Other support

For some members, the cost of a club dinner every month, or fortnight, may be onerous.

Clubs may wish to consider commencing meetings with a purely social dinner, allowing members to join for the formal meeting afterwards. Alternatively, clubs could commence with a meeting, and allow members to choose if they wish to stay for dinner.

Let's consider ways to not only be flexible, but make membership affordable for everyone, so that we can continue to help our communities and make a real difference.


