Advice of Voting Delegates authorised by the Club's President or Secretary is to be provided to the Secretary prior to the commencement of the AGM on 04 December 2022.

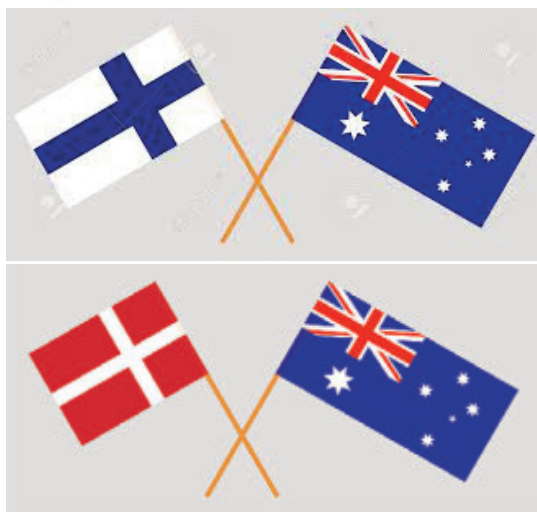
Directors may be appointed Voting Delegates by their Club.

Opportunities to travel to Finland and Denmark with Lions Operation Friendship

District 201 Q1 Lions have been invited to visit either Finland or Denmark in March/April 2023.

THE CONCEPT OF LIONS OPERATION FRIENDSHIP:

Operation Friendship visitors are expected to accept the responsibility of representing their Lions District and community and are thus ambassadors for Lionism. The overall aim is to promote Lionism and establish friendly relations, learn about Lionism in other countries, and pass on information about Lionism in their home countries. Visitors achieve this by attending and addressing the District Convention, visiting Lions Clubs and Lions Projects, joining in community events such as festivals, sports days and annual shows. This is summed up in two of the Purposes of Lionism:

‘To create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world’.

‘To unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding’.

THE VISIT:

You are required to pay your own international and domestic travel costs. Your visit to the international Lions District will be about 30 days (including the days of arrival

and departure). The dates will depend on when the Lions District Convention is held, but this will be in March -April 2023 for Denmark 106B and Finland 107N. You are required to prepare and present a 10-minute address, with PowerPoint slides if possible, at the Lions District Convention and attend some Lions Clubs as guests.

You are required to arrange your own travel insurance. This is most important. Be sure that you read the fine print and make sure you are covered for all possible problems. You are responsible for any personal and medical expenses during your stay.

During your visit you will be staying with 4 or 5 host families for about 5-6 days at each home. They will arrange a varied and interesting programme for your visit. The host families will be in different areas so that you see a variety of activities in the District. The host families will provide food in the family home and sightseeing in their respective areas. Where a hosting includes visits to theme parks, special attractions and restaurants, you may need to share the costs.

English is widely spoken and you will stay with Lions, and thus with people who will share a common philosophy of Lions altruism. It is usual that guests and hosts rapidly build a good rapport and understanding.

YOUR APPLICATION:

Should include:

- Name: You, and your partner's.
- Dates of birth
- Your contact details.
- Occupation, and if applicable, year's of retirement, for you, and your partner.
- Hobbies and interests.
- Lions involvement: how many years, positions held etc; your Club's location
- Other community service activities.
- A recent photograph must be included in the application.

Applications should be submitted by 25th November 2022, to the Project Coordinator, Lion Lyndon Kurth operationfriendship-twinning@lions201q1.org.au 0416 036 252

The successful applicants will be advised by 19th December 2022, which will give adequate time for travel preparations. If you have further questions, please feel free to contact me.

Diabetes



Diabetes

Diabetes is a Global epidemic.

An estimated 463 million adults across the world are living with diabetes, and its prevalence is increasing rapidly. By 2045, the number is expected to reach 700 million. Diabetes is a global epidemic that touches every corner of the globe.

1 in 2 Cases undiagnosed (232 million)

**1 in 5 People above 65 years
old have diabetes**

**1 in 10 Adults are living with diabetes
(537 Million around the world)**

4.2 M Deaths from diabetes in 2019

Lions, with the support of Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), are working to reduce the prevalence of diabetes and improve the lives of those living with diabetes.

World Diabetes Day

World Diabetes Day is the 14th November, every year and was first created in 1991 by the International Diabetes foundation and the World Health Foundation. I would encourage clubs to start organising a function to celebrate this day.

Lap the Map for Diabetes

The first MD201 “Lions Lap the Map for Diabetes” event was conducted in conjunction with World Diabetes Day in November 2019, following the success of that activity, the Council of Governors at the January 2020 Council Meeting, adopted that this becomes an Annual Multiple District Project.

The Australian Lions national promotion is held annually to coincide with World Diabetes Day, with all Clubs encouraged to participate.

Lap the Map will enable us to focus our effort in one coordinated major Diabetes Project and maximise PR and Public Awareness (National and Local) of what Lions are doing in the Fight against Diabetes

I encourage everyone to conduct some sort of Fund Raising in support of Diabetes Awareness.

If your club is hosting a function where your members are walking around a park, or any other activity that includes walking or running, don't forget to count your steps, and if you are a daily walker you can count your steps for the whole month of November. When you have your final total of each member's steps don't forget to record them on My Lion.

When the time gets closer I can advise clubs on how to record your, Lap the Map, steps.

For those going to the District Convention I will have more information on Diabetes at my stand.

World Sight Day

This World Sight Day, take the pledge to #LoveYourEyes

World Sight Day is the perfect time for Australian's to take the pledge to #LoveYourEyes.

World Sight Day, held on **Thursday 13th October**, is an international event that provides an opportunity to focus the world's attention on the importance of good eye health and vision care.

This years World Sight Day will focus on the #LoveYourEyes campaign which aims for **5 million sight tests to be pledged** (<https://www.iapb.org/world-sight-day/pledging-tool/>) during the month leading up to World Sight Day.

#LoveYourEyes is about creating awareness that everyone, at some stage in life, will experience an eye health issue. Those of us who can access eye care should prioritise our eye health and support efforts to ensure that everyone enjoys the same access.

With 90% or blindness and vision loss avoidable or treatable if detected early enough. Vision 2020 Australia, is calling on all Australian's to show their support for World Sight Day by pledging to get their eyes tested.

Australian's are fortunate to have access to some of the best eye care services in the world. Eye tests can be arranged directly with an optometrist without the need for a referral from a GP and are usually covered by Medicare.

Key tips for looking after eye health:

- Make sure you have a regular eye check, especially if you are over 40
- Wear a hat and sunglasses when outside
- Wear eye protection when playing sports like squash, or performing hazardous work
- Quit smoking
- Maintain a healthy diet with regular exercise
- Manage your diabetes (blood glucose, blood pressure and cholesterol levels)

Sharing your Club's latest happenings and projects via Social Media should be one of the priorities for a Club. It keeps your followers up to date, promotes awareness of your Club and projects, spreads awareness of issues in your Community and connects with those who may need support.

If you're struggling to think of something to post, I've included some ideas for you.

SHARE WHAT YOUR CLUB IS DOING.

There are so many Clubs out there doing wonderful projects which are never shared with others outside the Club. If you're helping out in the Community with a fun run, gardening etc, let everyone know. If you're making items to donate to a hospital, Meals on Wheels, aged care home etc, take photos and share. If you're participating at a Community movie night by providing a barbeque, take some photos of Club members having fun whilst participating.

SHARE YOUR IMPACT

Show others what your Club can accomplish. By sharing achievements, gratitude and positivity, you'll attract support and maybe members down the line.

SHARE A TESTIMONIAL.

Share how someone's life has been impacted by what you do. This could be someone who has been involved in one of your projects, be it someone who's received assistance from your Club or a volunteer.

SHARE AN INSPIRATIONAL QUOTE.

Motivate your social media followers with one of your favourite quotes, but relate it back to our Organisation or your Club. Make a fun graphic to go with the quote to get people's attention.

SHARE A SPECIAL DAY

There are many special days on the calendar that can be shared. Choose a few that relate to our Organisation or Club, and share your message. e.g. National Seniors Week – does your Club have a project to help seniors, Childhood Cancer Awareness month – does your Club get involved with support for this cause, Save the Koala month – does your Club have an environment project that may relate, World Kindness Day – show an example of how this day relates to activities of your members etc. One website that has some ideas for special days is: <https://www.un.org/en/observances/list-days-weeks>

SHARE YOUR HISTORY

Do the occasional "Flashback Friday" or "Throwback Thursday" featuring a photo and short story from your archives.

SHARE AN UPCOMING EVENT

Most Clubs always have something happening in their upcoming calendar. Promote this on your social media.

SHARE YOUR PURPOSE

Remind your followers why you do what you do and why it matters. Use personal stories to support your point.

SHARE OUR LIONS CAUSES

There are many posts created by our Foundations, Leaders and Districts but if sharing, add in how your Club has contributed or relate it to one of your upcoming events. Remember that these posts are seen by many – you need to give yours that point of difference so people will engage.

SHARE YOUR MEMBERS HAVING FUN

Whether it be participating in a project or a purely social activity, take photos or short videos of your members enjoying themselves.

These instructions are for those club secretaries that have never logged in or forgotten details or simply lost access to District Office Account.

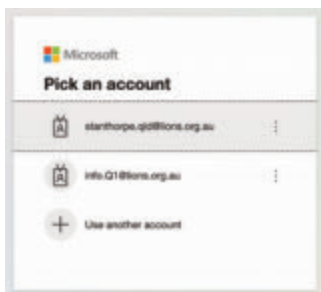
1. Simply go to **office.com**

2. Click **Sign In**

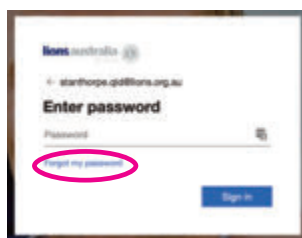

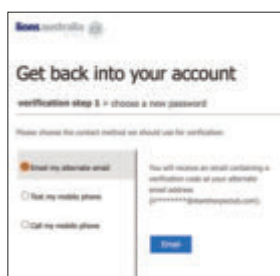
4. If password is unknown click on the "Forgot my password"



5. You will need to entry a picture code and Select **Next**

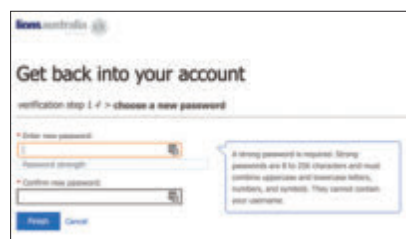

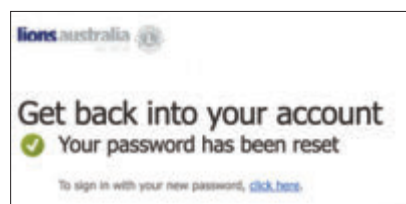


You have to entry the Full Email Recovery address or the Mobile Number and hit the Send or TXT button

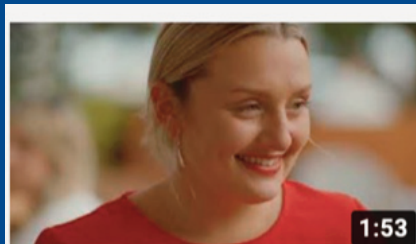

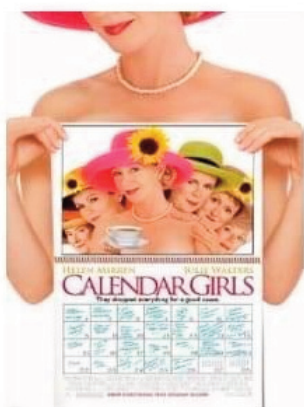

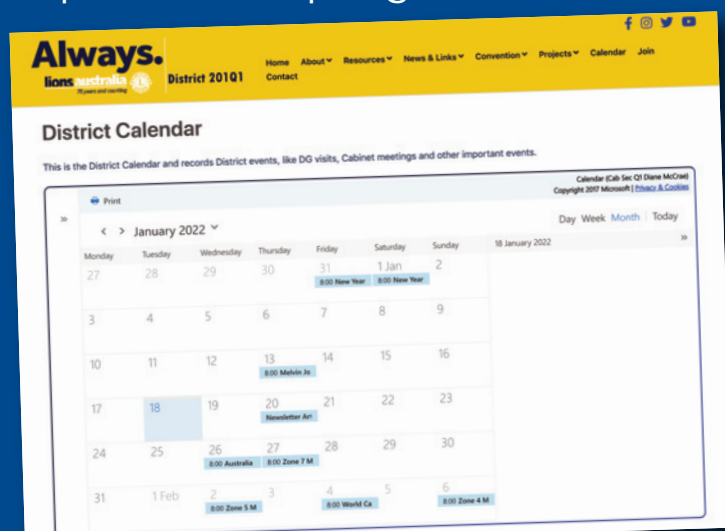
