**A KOALA KINDY ENCLOSURE**

What's a koala kindy? Once orphaned joeys are no longer on bottled supplement feeding, they need to be transferred to a larger enclosure (koala kindy) where they have more space to roam & much higher branches to learn to climb and jump from branch to branch. They also have far less human contact as would happen in the wild. After this phase, they go from this "kindy" to plantation stage

A koala kindy enclosure costs between \$20,000 - \$30,000. We were pleased to be able to raise a substantial contribution at this function towards the funds needed and have other fundraisers planned to continue with this important environmental project.

## Community Seating....

The Lions Club of Alstonville formally handed in its Charter on 31st December after 43 years of service to the community and subsequently had it cancelled by Lions International. It was several months before its Registration of Incorporation was cancelled by the Department of Fair Trading. However in the dispersal of Club's Funds to local groups funding for community seating was set aside for the local Sub Branch of the RSL towards seating in the Memorial Park, the Ballina Shire Council towards seating in the Alstonville Cemetery (see photo) and the local Land Care group for seating in Bulwinkel Park, formally the Lions Park.

When the Club closed there were only four active members and three of these have continued their Lions' Service with the neighbouring Goonellabah-Wollongbar & Districts Lions Club. This Club has

continued with two of the Alstonville projects, the Thursday night Bingo at the Alstonville Sports and Bowling Club and recycling with the support of the Alstonville Aquatic Centre. This has enabled the Lions presence in Alstonville to continue and hopefully see more positive outcomes in the future.

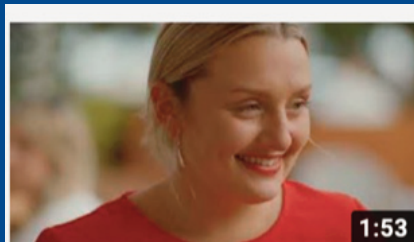

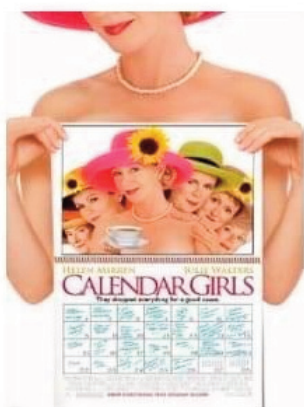
