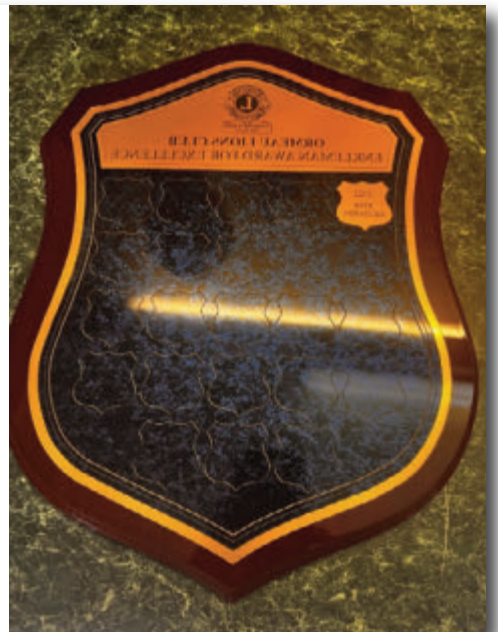

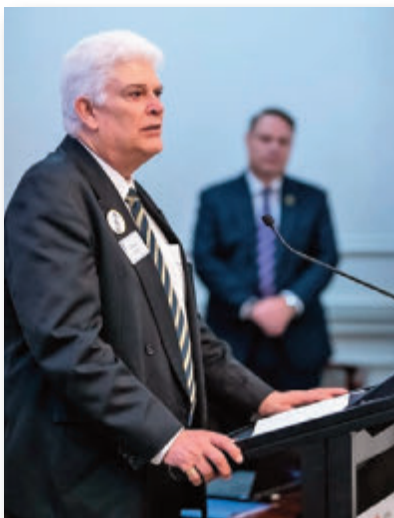

Gents

as you may be aware, the Lions Club of Logan Village Inc. have built and own a Bash Car, an old WB Statesman. It was built in 2021, after being located in a paddock, a rusty old rats nest that was bought back to life and has now completed two Variety Bash events in 2021 and 2022.

From the 15th August 2023, the vehicle will again take to the road on the Variety Bash from Toowoomba to Cairns. At this stage Lions Phil (that's me), Lion Brad (Secretary), Lion Bill and Lion Doug will pilot the vehicle northwards through the outback and bush tracks.

In 2021 our club raised \$8500 and in 2022 reached Bronze status by raising \$11,500.

In 2023 we hope to do much better and raise well over \$25,000 for those disadvantaged children in need, right across Qld

As you can imagine, fundraising will begin in earnest in January.

Currently the vehicle is branded "Logan Village Lions" but we are seeking assistance from other Q1 Lions Clubs and are desirous of co branding the car as Q1 Lions.

After 2023, our Club would like to see other Lions Clubs within Q1 jump on board and take our car on a bash, as we are fast running out of troops to commit. The way we see it working is that we loan our car to another club (or clubs), they register, put a team together and obtain their sponsors to put on the car and assist with their fundraising. After the bash, they return the car to our club on the basis "you break it you fix it". We then use the vehicle for promotional purposes (we currently use it as a tow vehicle to events), then the following year it all begins again.

So to kick off our 2023 Variety campaign, we are seeking input from other Q1 Lions Clubs through financial donations. This donations can be small or large. I will add and acknowledge that in 2021, our first bash, both



Ballina and Stanthorpe clubs made substantial financial contributions (and their stickers still have pride of place on our vehicle).

Donations can be made to our Club (we have a specific Variety Bash Account) or directly to our Car on the Variety bash website:

Also, if any clubs know of sponsors that would like to grace our vehicle, we have sponsorships packages from \$100 to \$2000, depending on size and location on the car. Each year we begin afresh with new sponsors and sponsorship is vital to our fundraising efforts.

Gentleman, if you consider this worthwhile, we would seek you to actively promote the Variety Bash Car within Q1, so that we can make this a Q1 Lions collaborative effort and raise as much funds as we possible can. It's a great cause and the 2022 Variety Bash raised over \$2 million. As a club, The Logan Village Lions donated \$2000 from our Activities Account and our Community Hall donates 10% of our profit per annum (another \$2000). So we are putting our money where our mouth is, while still actively fundraising and supporting our local community through our usual Activities. We see the Variety Bash as being in addition to our usual day to day Lions activity so that it never adversely affects what we do locally. Only last week we completed our annual Golf Day (\$9500 raised) and currently conducting our annual Xmas raffle and on track to raise \$7000.

If you consider this a just cause and something you could get behind, please let me know. Happy to forward any further information, photos and bank details, if you would be willing to promote and circulate within Q1 Lions Clubs.

The Foundation has funded 54 researchers since its inception in 1963 and boasts several high profile identities and major breakthroughs.

Every Lions Club upon charter automatically becomes a constituent member of the foundation.

This enables each club to vote for director appointments and other important issues at the Annual General Meeting.

Recently, with the help of Mr David Hoskot from Griffith University, incoming Lions District Governors (Q Districts) were taken on a tour of the research laboratories at the Gold Coast Campus of Griffith University to give them an insight into the wonderful work of the Foundation. Dr Olivia Holland from Griffith University Research is currently funded by LMRF along with Dr Dominic Guanzon of UQCCR. Dr Olivia Holland's research is in gestational diabetes and the link to other health issues including Type 2 diabetes.

Lions Eye Health Children's Vision Screening Program

There are a few members in District 201Q1 who have completed online training to enable Lions to support the introduction of the Lions Eye Health Children's Vision Screening Program in our district. It would be appreciated if there were more members who would be interested in completing this training to facilitate the introduction of this valuable program for young children in our district. The online component of the program takes approximately 30 minutes. Before being able to conduct the program, a face-to-face training program is also required. This takes less than one day and is conducted by a LEHP Qualified Vision Screener who lives interstate. The 'Hands-on Training Workshop' will only be conducted when a sufficient number of participants are available and have completed the online training prerequisite.

This is an Australian Lions program that has been created by Lions in consultation with its technical partner, the Centre for Eye Health in Sydney. It can be conducted by Lions who have undertaken the required training, using the materials provided and following the processes and methods approved by LEHP. It is acknowledged that Lions are not medical professionals and that the outcome of the Lions children's vision screening program is not a diagnosis but a recommendation to the child's

parent that further medical investigation of that child's vision is recommended.

Would you kindly consider participating in this program and contact me if you would be interested in undertaking this training with a view to participating in the program.

Christmas - a guide to what you can and can't recycle

Gift wrapping

Carefully unwrap your gifts. You can save the paper and reuse it for future Christmas or birthday gifts.

Wrapping made from 100% paper can go in your yellow lid bin. Consider using these instead of metallic wrapping or paper with glitter or foil detail, which can't be recycled and will end up in landfill.

Real Christmas trees

Break small trees up into pieces and put them in your green lid bin along with your garden organics. However you dispose of your tree, remove all decorations and don't wrap it in plastic.

Plastic Christmas trees

They may be reusable, but plastic Christmas trees are often made of materials that can't be recycled. If your unwanted plastic Christmas tree is in good condition, you might like to try Facebook Marketplace, Gumtree, etc.

Fairy lights, LEDs and other electronics

Electronics can contain toxic materials and don't belong in the bin. If you've scored some new gadgets and need to get rid of your old ones, you have a few options. If the old gadgets are working, donate or sell them. If not contact an E Waste company so the goods are recycled.



Batteries

Sales of batteries spike during the festive season. But once you're done with them, batteries can be a huge environmental hazard. Try to use rechargeable batteries, but even these need to be disposed of carefully. Otherwise recycle batteries through OfficeWorks, Aldi, Battery World.

Styrofoam or polystyrene

Polystyrene or Styrofoam can't be recycled in your yellow lid bin.

Aluminium disposable food and baking trays

Aluminum foil trays can be recycled in your yellow lid bin – just remove any food and oil and scrunch them into a ball shape, like regular foil.

Unwanted gifts

Donate, sell, or re-gift. Sometimes you just don't want, or need, what's been given to you.

If you're re-gifting, just remember who gave you the present. You don't want to be caught returning it to them – now that could be awkward.

2022 has been a wild and busy year for Australian Lions Hearing Dogs.

With Australia and border restrictions finally recovering from Covid, we were able to get back on our feet. This year our team has not only set several new records, but also went above and beyond! The end of 2022 was met with 31 Hearing Assistance Dogs delivered. These dogs improve the independence and security to people who are deaf or hard of hearing, and has proven time and time again that they play a vital role in reducing the feelings of isolation that comes as a challenge to hearing loss. However, that's not all. Our very first

Diabetic Alert dog from the Medical Alert Program was placed here in Adelaide mid-October! This is a huge accomplishment as it is the start of our Medical Alert Program. We are excited to see the good our Diabetic Alert dogs will bring to people with type 1 diabetes.

Our team were able to accredit 17 dogs this year, but we are expecting 5 more to be done before 2023 arrives; a total of 59 flights taken all across Australia in 2022! Accreditation occurs after the dogs have completed their minimum of 3 months follow up in a client's home and are alerting to sounds at a high standard.

Our Breeding Program, which was only started recently, has already brought about 15 puppies into our world year to date, but we are expecting another litter of puppies to be born in December, which will bring the total numbers of puppies born up to 20 plus or more! Because of this, 32 new puppy partnerships were created this year by the Puppy Program, plus 9 more to go within the year. With the help of their foster homes, these puppies will be loved, given attention, learn boundaries and socialisation. Currently, there are 18 puppies placed in foster care, but the number will be up to 26 before January 2023 comes.

We also have had many wonderful sponsors from both Lions Clubs and individual supporters of our puppies. We couldn't have made it without them and we're extremely grateful for the help and opportunity that they've provided Australian Lions Hearing Dogs. The volunteer program has thrived as always, with over 30 volunteers involved in the program, always there to help and give the dogs the enrichment and love they need to be happy and healthy.

We are still hard at work on our Capital Campaign and while we've made progress, we still have some ways to go before reaching our goal!

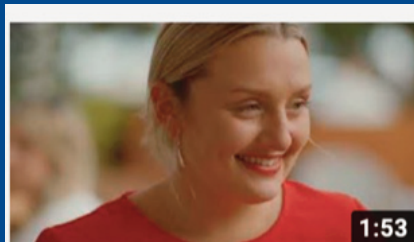
