Cyber Security

At Lions Clubs International, we pride ourselves in service to others. Our efforts bring notoriety and respect from communities worldwide. Unfortunately, this notoriety can also attract individuals that misrepresent themselves to gain access to personal or financial information. When individuals use the internet or phone to commit this type of fraud it is commonly known as "phishing."

LCI systems are password protected for your safety and restrict access to personal information including email addresses and phone numbers. Outside of our LCI systems, Club information is widely known in our local communities through the media or non-LCI websites, and it is quite easy to obtain. This visibility also increases the chance of being contacted by a phisher.

Hi my name is Paul Drake I am a member of Stanthorpe Lions Club.

What is Essential Tremor, ET is a neurological condition that causes an uncontrollable tremor or shaking usually on the dominant side which makes simple everyday actions that most people do without thinking almost impossible.

I live with this condition although I consider myself one of the lucky ones, ET mainly only affects my hands with leg slight tremors and at my voice at times. Some of my ET friends have implants in the brain, others have full body tremor. Because ET is an action tremor these things are now becoming an issue for me the closer to the action the worse the tremor it also becomes worse with stress.

- 1 Writing and signing my name.
- 2 Pouring boiling water from a kettle.(Have to be very very careful.)
- 4 Drinking from a cup without spilling the contents.
- 5 Shaving.
- 6 Buttoning shirts etc

Basically anything that requires a steady hand

Most people are aware of Parkinson's Disease which is classed as a stationary tremor, it seems that both conditions stem from the same area of the brain and there are some prescription drugs for parkinson's but the drugs prescribed for ET are usually Beta Blockers and Anti Seizure medications. And as usual these come with unwanted side effects

ET is estimated to be six times more common than

Parkinson's but goes largely undiagnosed or
misdiagnosed, it tends to become evident in later

life as in my case in my late fifties, as dismissed as RSI having worked all my working life with power tools and hammers.

With limited medications available there are other options DBS where probes are planted in the brain connected to a device similar to a heart pacemaker or High Frequency Ultrasound where part of the brain is destroyed both are a last resort and very costly. In the region of \$30,000.

In 2019 I helped to establish a support group Southern Qld Essential Tremor Support Group which now has 80 or so followers, also here in Stanthorpe formed Granite Belt Et Support Group which now has 30 odd followers. Whilst on FaceBook there are a few support groups in Australia. In the UK the National Tremor Foundation and In USA International Essential Tremor Foundation both run fundraisers to fund research and at present here in Australia I don't think any fundraising is done to support research into Essential Tremor.

ET can cause head and voice tremors and in some cases full body tremors.

ET is not confined to the elderly children can be born with ET , if one of your parents has ET there's a 50% chance you will inherit ET.

As in my case ET Sufferers start to withdraw from social gatherings and become self conscious of their tremors Since talking about and gaining support from my fellow Lions I'm now much more comfortable with ET. Club Member Stuart Perrett put together a PP Presentation for us to use which has been presented to Tenterfield Llons Club.

Toowoomba West Lions Club Warwick Lions Club also to our local Rotary Clubs.

My mission is to challenge all district 201Q1 Clubs to find that person with a Tremor be it Essential Tremor, Parkinsons or any other tremor invite them for a coffee and form a support group.



BE AWARE OF SCAMS PROTECT YOURSELF

During recent months, there have been an increasing number of phone, text, social media and email scams. Be aware of scams that fraudulently use the Lions Clubs International (LCI) or Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) name or logo, or other trusted and well-known names from within the Lions family.

The goal of these types of scams is to trick people into revealing personal and financial information about themselves.

As a general practice when receiving unsolicited emails, do not follow embedded links in emails, especially if there is any mention of updating credit card information, personal date, PIN numbers, or passwords. Delete these emails immediately.



If contacted by another club member, district cabinet member or any other Lion via email, mobile text message or social media and there is a request for financial assistance in any form, do not reply to the message. Contact the person separately to validate that the request is legitimate.





FOR SALE – LIONS BBQ/REFRIGERATED COOK TRAILER

We have for sale a fully equipped BBQ/Refrigerated trailer in excellent condition.

Asking price is \$11,000 (negotiable) – well below replacement cost.

The base trailer is an Opal brand, manufactured in 09/2004. It has been extensively modified and equipped with two barbecue plates – 1 x 3 burner (approx.1000mm x 550 mm) and 1 x 2 burner (approx. 850 x 550 mm) and two 8.5 kg gas bottles.

The trailer is fitted with a commercial grade refrigerator approximately 1.5 m3 capacity (1.85 metres wide. 1.00 metre deep and 0.8 metres height.







The trailer was professionally wired to run on 240 volts, either from a 15 amp mains source or it can be connected to a suitable portable generator which can be housed in a locked cabinet on the front drawbar.

External 240v LED lights at the front of the trailer and under the cooking area allow night time use. The cooking area is also equipped with extraction fans at the front and back of the trailer.

The trailer is 2 metres wide, and 2.3 metres long including the drawbar. It has LED tail lights and is equipped with electric brakes. It has a 7 pin round plug, but also included is an adapter for a 7 pin flat plug. The rear access door acts as a ramp to facilitate loading of extra items in the underfloor cavity. Included is a general tool box with a bottle jack and various wheel chocks and levelling ramps.

The drawbar is equipped with a swing up ratchet jockey wheel and also a static swing up stand, to allow for a wider range of tow ball heights.







Other inclusions are a 1kg powder fire extinguisher, fire blanket and a small water tank.

The trailer is registered until October 2023 and is fitted with brand new tyres, including the spare wheel. The trailer has been garaged and is in excellent condition.

A roadworthy certificate and gas certificate will be issued on confirmation of sale.
