
121km Bike Trail

My name is Diane Henderson. I am the Lions Cakes and Mints Project Co-ordinator for Lions District 201Q1 for 2023-2024. I am a member of the Algester Parkinson Lions Club.

Please feel free to start placing your orders. Don't forget that there is only one Discount Period: 1 July 2023 – 31 October 2023 and the discounted price is only available if payment and delivery are made within the discounted period.

You will notice that the sale price of cakes and puddings has increased this year. The 1.5 kg cakes sell for \$20 each; 1 kg cakes are \$16; puddings are \$16 and the price of mini cakes remains unchanged at \$2.

Below you will find the instructions on how to order Lions Cakes and Puddings.

Just to avoid any confusion, I would like to assure you that, although the password seems wrong since it mentions *westons* and *2020*, it is actually correct. I hope you find the system easy to operate.

How to Order Lions Cakes and Puddings

All orders must be on the current and official order form. It is preferred that orders be typed (not handwritten) and sent via email (if sending by Australia Post please allow an extra 10 working days, total 20 working days for processing and delivery).

STEP 1 Go to the Australian Lions Web page at www.lionsclubs.org.au

Click on *Get Involved, Fundraising, Lions Mints and Cakes*

STEP 2 Click on the *cake order form* link.

You will be asked to enter a password.

Password is *westons2020*

The order form document link will open, so download, and open file - order form will open. Save to your computer.

STEP 3 Complete the order form you have saved by typing in details.

Please ensure all required information is placed on the order form.

Once completed don't forget to "save" again the order form.

STEP 4 Open your email account.

Attach your saved order form to a new email and send to lions@traditionalfoods.com.au

A confirmation email will be returned.



Please note: Invoice will be sent to the email address on the order form at the time of ordering, so please ensure your Club's official email address is used. Please pass all invoices to your Club's Treasurer for payment.



Lions Header Card

The header card will need to be updated with the new minimum donation price. We have created an easy solution to update the pricing.

Print, cut and glue the attached sheet with the new pricing of 80c for all existing Lions header cards.



Damaged or Lost in Transit Products

If a product is damaged during transit, contact Dollar Sweets. You will need to provide details of the extent and type of damage and the quantity and type of goods affected. Dollar Sweets will lodge a complaint with the freight company on behalf of the relevant Lions Club. Photographic evidence of damaged goods may be requested so it is advised to hold onto any damaged goods until you have spoken to Dollar Sweets.

Goods lost in transit will only be replaced once confirmation has been received from the courier that the order is unrecoverable. Once confirmation has been received, replacement goods will be sent on the next available dispatch day.

Dollar Sweets must be notified as soon as possible of any damaged or lost in transit goods. Credits claims may be rejected if too much time has lapsed.

- All club reports submitted online by the due date.
- Attendance at the 2023-2024 Incoming Club Officers Development Day.
- Completing incoming Club Officers on Lions Portal by due date.
- Responds to all District correspondence promptly.
- Attended the 2023 District Convention at Goondiwindi. (ART OF SERVICE)

3. Lions Christmas Cakes & Puddings (MD201)

To be assessed based on total sales from July 2023 to March 2024. Awards will be made at the District Changeover in 2024 for:

- Highest sales by weight

Note: Winning clubs must be in good standing and have paid all outstanding product supply invoices by end of January 2024.

4. Lions Mints

To be assessed based on total sales from July 2023 to June 2024. Awards will be made at the District Changeover in 2024 for:

- Highest sales by weight

Note: Winning clubs must be in good standing and have paid all outstanding product supply invoices.
