STORY DOGS

FROM THE DESK OF THE DISTRICT STORY DOGS CHAIRPERSON



This is a support program that runs in primary schools to help School Children with their reading ability, Students are selected by the principal or teacher, and in a quiet area of the school, outside the classroom, the accredited dog and its handler along with the student, have a one on one 20 minute session reading to the dog.

As you can imagine over a period of time the outcomes are amazing with improved reading skills, their confidence soars, focus improves and they are having fun while not being judged.

Volunteers are always needed, not any dog has the temperament, obedience and willingness to become a Story Dog but you may know of such a dog (all breeds are welcome, except restricted breeds) that may be able to assist in this great work to improve a student's reading ability in your area.

There are many school students, throughout our District, who because of parent time limitations at home, are not being read to, not even a bedtime story. As a Lions Club, you may be able to sponsor a Story Dog in your school community and help a student to become confident and build up self esteem in their reading ability.

If I can help your club in any way, please let me know. I am also happy to attend a meeting of your club to talk about this great program.

Hi Lions

Have you thought about joining the Peace Poster & Essay Contests. It is not too late for Clubs to contact schools, scout, guide, church groups to join in this great contest. Creating peace posters/essays gives children everywhere the chance to express their visions of peace and inspire the world through art and creativity. Something that is so needed today.

Kits must be purchased by Clubs for **each** school group etc that you approach. These are available from Lions Australia National Office Club Supplies, Newcastle www.lionsclubsshop.com.au or call 02 4940 8033, at a cost of \$25 plus postage. Students who are 11, 12 or 13 years of age by 15th November are eligible to participate.

The Theme this year is **"DARE TO DREAM."** All media accepted. Chalk, charcoal and pastel entries should be sealed with a fixative spray to prevent smearing. Most students use coloured pencils. Lettering in any language or numbering on the front of the poster in any language is not permitted. I have the paper which I can post to you. Our winners will be judged at the District Cabinet Meeting so we need to start NOW to have these posters ready for judging. I will need to have posters to me **by Friday 10th November, 2023** .

This is a great way to interact with your school, community and to get the Lions name out there. A little tip – maybe offer the winning posters either a monetary prize or a little trophy – doesn't have to be anything big. Certificates for winners are in the kits that are purchased. This year a certificate has been produced at no cost to clubs for all participants, I have these and will forward on. This encourages the students/schools, groups to participate.

ESSAY CONTEST

The rules for this state that the student needs to be visually impaired. Visually impaired means many things, colour blind and low vision fall into this category. Many students in the 11-13 age range are in the mainstream school system so this could also be encouraged when you visit the schools. The essay must be no longer than 500 words, submitted in English, typewritten in black ink and double spaced. Each entry must be submitted with a completed entry form. The Theme is **"DARE TO DREAM"**

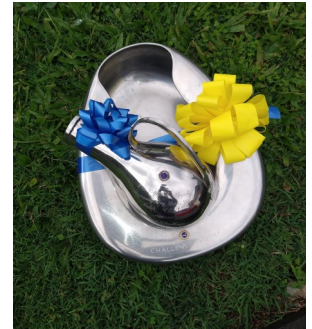

Our environment is more than a background – it's our home. And we're committed to caring for it.

In 1972, Lions Clubs made a commitment to servicing the community in environmental related projects.

Over 3,000 environmental projects are carried out by Lions in Australia every year.

These projects are aimed to improve the quality of air, water and land as well as protect and preserve local flora and fauna.

Why does our Club support the [Queensland Koala Society Inc](#) ? It's because of the fabulous work they do to rescue, rehabilitate and hopefully release our native wildlife back to where they belong.

Club member Therese, who volunteers regularly with QKS had the privilege of meeting little koala joey Noreen, whose Mum was sadly killed by a car in Camp Hill mid-July. Little Noreen was less than half a kilo in weight when she was rescued and requires feeds every 2 - 3 hours with her specialised koala milk formula, pap and soft tips of eucalyptus leaves. The koala milk alone is expensive to purchase and the around-the-clock care will be ongoing for some time. QKS have advised that this tiny girl is not only continuing to enjoy her bottle every 2-3 hours, but has also taken to regularly eating fresh cut leaves. It's still a long road ahead and we are celebrating every day she is doing well.

Once Noreen grows bigger, she'll need to learn the skills of an adult koala, climbing trees and sourcing her food. The Koala Kindy that QKS wants to build will help her with these skills.

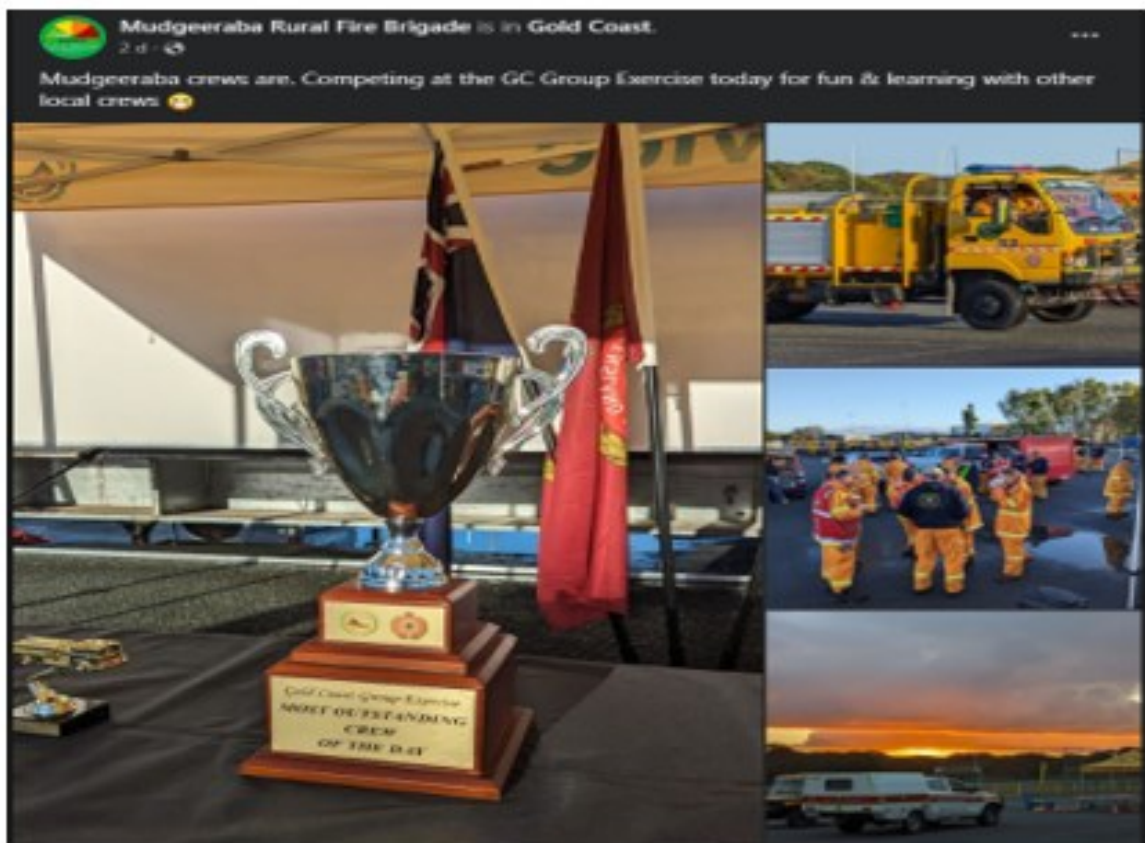
