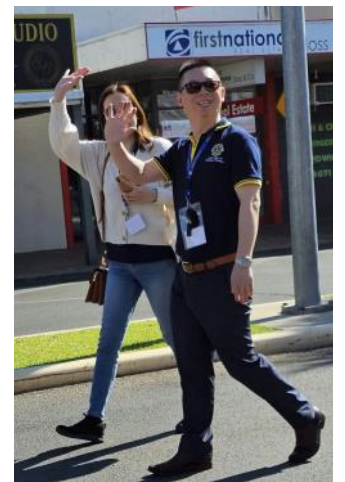

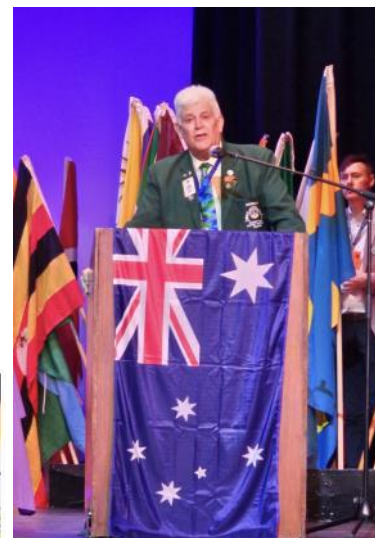

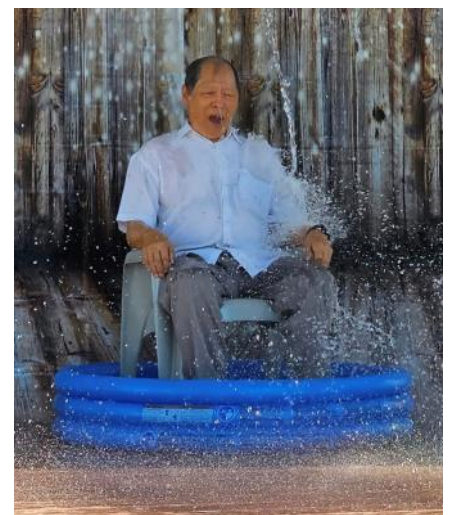

VALE PDG David Floyd

As we are all aware the Lions Australia Operation Smile Fundraiser (previously a Multi District Project), managed by the Brisbane Holland Park Lions Club has been one of our District's most successful endeavours. Lions and Leos all throughout Australia have achieved a great deal through the support of the Lions Australia Operation Smile Project. Since the project began in 2010, over 7,000 children and young people born with facial deformities have received surgeries on the medical missions for which we contributed.

The wonderful partnership between Operation Smile Australia and Lions Australia would not have been possible without the tireless effort and dedication from the late PDG David Floyd - Brisbane Holland Park Lions Club. David was acutely aware of the high level of need for safe healthcare in developing countries, including those of our nearest neighbours. He was passionate about providing children in these countries with an opportunity to live brighter, more hopeful lives.



In honour of David, Operation Smile Australia has made the decision to implement a scholarship in David's name

aimed at bringing young surgeons from the countries Operation Smile works in (likely the Philippines and Bangladesh) to Brisbane for an 8-week intensive training period under Operation Smile Founder and prominent surgeon Dr Richard Lewandowski. The scholarship recipient will learn surgical techniques and post-surgical care with the goal being for the trainee to return to their country and be self-sufficient in providing surgeries for children with cleft lip and cleft palate conditions. This will enable so many more children to receive the surgery that they need.

The Holland Park Lions Club is very grateful to Operation Smile Australia for this wonderful acknowledgement of one of its finest members.

Lions Road 50th Anniversary

On Sunday 17th September 2023 over 100 people gathered at Lions Road Lookout Park to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the opening of the Lions Road.

Guests came from as far away as Sydney, these included former Roads Minister Carl Scully, Local Member Janelle Saffin, members of the Hurley Family, PDG Peter Ho from District 201Q1 Cabinet, members of Beaudesert and Warwick Lions Clubs, Local Councillors including Mayor Kylie Thomas and Scenic Rim Deputy Mayor Jeff McConnell, past and current Kyogle Lions Club Members and many other locals who were connected to the construction of the road.



Kyogle Lions Club presented cheques to Kyogle (\$25,000) and Scenic Rim (\$15,000) Councils to help with the ongoing maintenance of the road, and a plaque was unveiled by Janelle Saffin, Carl Scully and current Kyogle Lions President Bob Scarborough who was also involved with building the road.

In 1969, when the NSW government rejected the building of the road, the local community, under the auspice of Kyogle Lions Club, decided to do it themselves. A world class scenic drive is the result. In 1971 the Beaudesert Lions Club became partners in the project. The project captured the imagination of the local community which contributed massive support in money, man hours and equipment time.

Who built the road by the glow worm's glen.*



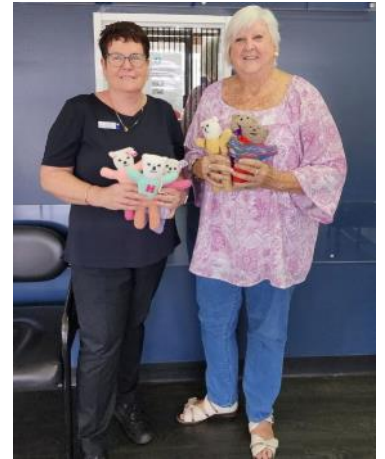

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY



Regular physical activity is one of the most important things you can do to improve your general health. It can also help manage your diabetes.

The more physically active you are, the greater the health benefits will be. Any activity, even at a slow pace, can have health benefits. Some activity is better than none at all.

Benefits of Physical Activity

Physical activity can lower your blood glucose levels. This is because movement helps the body use glucose as fuel for working muscles.

Your muscles need energy to move. This energy comes from glucose in the blood as well as glucose stored in the muscles. Sometimes, this energy also comes from stores in the liver.

There are many benefits of regular physical activity. These include:

- Reducing the risk of heart disease and stroke
- Lowering blood fats (cholesterol and triglyceride) levels
- Helping to lower blood pressure
- Assisting with weight loss and maintaining a healthy weight
- Slowing age-related loss of muscle mass
- Preventing Osteoporosis (also known as weak or brittle bones)
- Reducing the risk of falls
- Increasing strength, power and balance
- Improving mood
- Helping circulation in lower limbs

The dates have now been set for Queensland Youth of the Year (YOTY) Program after consideration for the national final, Easter and school holidays. The State judging needs to be conducted on this weekend to allow the mandatory four weeks before the National final and to have at least two weeks between the State and the District judging. Finals at each level are to be completed by these dates but can be hosted earlier.

All in all, when confirming arrangements with your Clubs, the following could be taken into account:

- Judging events need not occur on a weekend – Club week day meetings will be fine within the timeframe (subject to schools and judges being available)





- Judging events need not be an expensive exercise – some Clubs have a sandwich supper to save on the cost of full meals (particularly for guests)
- Remember that Winner Advisory Forms are to be kept at ALL Levels and forwarded as requested for action and eventually archiving by Multiple District
- Blue Cards/Exemption Cards are still necessary for judges
- All Lions involved should be aware of the Child Safe Policy (Multiple District) ... and where applicable, the correct working with children card (Blue) is current
- Some Clubs are arranging for the first level of judging to occur before final dates.

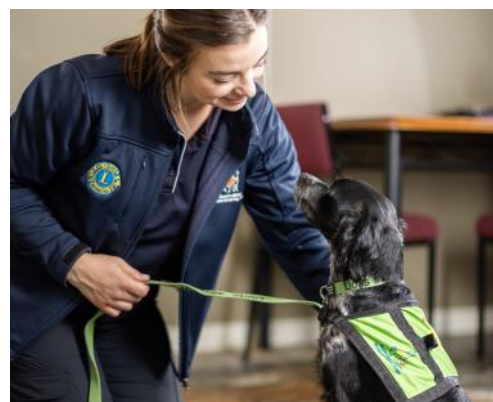
Lions Hearing Dogs

Dr Dominic Guanzone, current LMRF Research Fellow

Dr Dominic Guanzone is the latest recipient of the Queensland and Northern New South Wales Lions Medical Research Foundation Fellowship. Dr Guanzone is a research fellow based at the University of Queensland Exosome Biology Laboratory led by our previous senior research fellow, Associate Professor Carlos Salomon. The Exosome Biology Laboratory is located at the Centre for Clinical Diagnostics (CCD) within UQ Centre for Clinical Research (UQCCR).

Dr Guanzone, a well-published researcher, will be solving a significant problem in ovarian cancer by predicting when ovarian cancer recurs and whether it is resistant to cancer drugs (chemoresistance). Unfortunately, more than 60% of patients with advanced stage ovarian cancer develop recurrent disease, and prognosis is very poor due to chemoresistance.

Currently, there are no diagnostic tests available to predict ovarian cancer recurrence and chemoresistance. To address this need, Dr Guanzone has established the "EvOmics" subsidiary. Using blood from ovarian cancer patients, the EvOmics team will develop a diagnostic test to analyse all biomolecules within extracellular vesicles (EVs). Using this proteo-genomic approach has several advantages, such as requiring less blood and increased detection for recurrence and chemoresistance in women with ovarian cancer.

When completed, this blood diagnostic test would increase survival by 50% to 110% for women with the most common type of ovarian cancer (HGSOC).

By supporting Lions Medical Research Foundation, Dr Guanzone and his team can continue their life changing research into Ovarian Cancer.

Spring for Research

Dr Olivia Holland, current LMRF Research Fellow

I dream of a world where diabetes is under control, and where the impact of this major public health issue has been drastically reduced.

My name is Dr Olivia Holland, the 2019 & 2022 recipient of the Lions Medical Research Foundation Fellowship, and with support from LMRF, I study diabetes.

The World Health Organisation estimates that 422 million adults had diabetes in 2014, and these numbers continue to rise. Gestational diabetes is a type of diabetes that occurs during pregnancy. In Australia, gestational diabetes makes up over a quarter of insulin treated diabetes cases, equating to over 100 women registered with gestational diabetes each day.

The consequences of gestational diabetes doesn't end with pregnancy. Thirty percent of children born from a gestational diabetic pregnancy will develop type 2 diabetes later in life, and one in two women who had gestational diabetes will also develop type 2 diabetes within five to ten years.

I hope to better understand gestational diabetes, and to make a positive impact on women and their children who might otherwise be our future diabetics. I hope that by helping during pregnancy we can prevent the damage before it happens.

The Lions community is committed to funding research that will impact the health of Australians and people around the world, with diabetes a Global Cause for Lions Clubs International.

Medical research can improve many lives, and your support can help in kick starting the work of the next generation of researchers.

I invite you to help fund emerging researchers like myself, who over the coming years aim to make a difference to important health issues. Thank you - We couldn't do it without you.
