We are currently working on these tasks, but we need your help we need a member of each club or zone to put up their hand to help with coming up and delivering these tasks to our district. BAM (Big Audacious Mission)

At our Convention in Goondiwindi last month International Director Tim Irvine asked the conventioneers if they knew about BAM and I was amazed to see there were a lot of Lions who didn't know what it was, so I have put together this issue to give you an insight on BAM.

BAM is a goal for Australian Lions to reach 30,000 members by the year 2030 and 50,000 members by the year 2050. Can this be achieved you ask! Well yes it can, very simple all that needs to happen is an increase of members per club by +1. +1 you ask? That means your club needs to increase its membership by 1 each year therefore if your club loses 2 members your club need to find 2+1=3 new members in the lion's year. Easy right? Not really you say, well look at why we are losing members and ask yourselves what we are doing to retain these member/s. Not gaining any new members ask yourselves why?

If you feel that you need help, why not ask our membership team on Cabinet to assist with your club membership retention and membership drive. Michael MacDonald our retention chairperson is well equipped to assist. Our Membership Chairperson Kerry Kilpatrick can assist your club on ways to recruit new members.

I would like to welcome Greg Woodard to our team as our Leo Coordinator. Greg has been involved with MORETON BAY BOYS COLLEGE Leos and is doing some amazing things with the Leo team and is passionate with supporting our Leos in our district. 



2023-2024 Youth of the Year Program - Please Note

- The Entry Form, please emphasise that the importance of the age of the entrant is correct- over 15 and under 19 as at the 30th, June 2024.
- Child Safe Policy. Judges need to have current 'Working With Children Check' cardslook at people with existing cards – Govt. employees, NSW clubs to follow their guidelines. This is an electronic process and is quick.
- Finals at each level are to be completed by these dates but can be hosted earlier.
 Late entries for any final date will not progress through the next level.
- Judging events need not occur on a weekend Club weekday meetings will be fine within the timeframe (subject to schools and judges being available)
- Judging events need not be an expensive exercise some Clubs have a sandwich supper to save on the cost of full meals (particularly for guests)
- Remember that Winner Advisory Forms are to be kept at ALL Levels and forwarded as requested for action and eventually archiving by Multiple District
- Blue Cards/Exemption Cards are still necessary for judges.
- All Lions involved should be aware of the Child Safe Policy (Multiple District) ... and where applicable, the correct working with children card is current.
- Gifts are to be mementos of the event, Lions pens, pins, books, check out the Lions
 MD201 Shop online purchases within the costings.
- Club prizes and gifts should be covered under the YOTY District Guidelines
- See if your club can get some publicity through the school/college Facebook,
 Website, or local papers.

Q & A

Q. Can the final dates and materials be sent out earlier than the July, so Clubs can get in touch with schools/colleges?

A. The dates are set down by the National YOTY Committee based on the National Convention date and working backwards down to club level. There are set spacings between the National. State and District finals.

The dates are the last dates for finals to be held so the paperwork can be passed on to the next level.

Clubs can hold their finals before December if they want and Zone and possibly regional groups could organise their finals earlier than the last date, if this helps with schools/colleges.

As most of the information is like the next year's resources, Clubs can use the existing paperwork for recruiting the schools/colleges in early part of the school year.

Clubs can make these decisions.

Q. When will kits be handed out?

A. Paper kits which were handed out at Convention are no longer happening. All the materials are now found on the MD201 website <u>Youth of the Year - Lions Clubs Australia</u>.

This saves money in printing and delivering, clubs can personalise the paperwork for their YOTY activities.

Q. How much do Clubs pay for entry?

A. No, Part of the Clubs' MD2301Q1 dues now covers the past costs. Also the dues cover zone and regional finals costs and what can be claimed is shown below.


