

Narelle Parkins, past District Governor District 201 and current President of the Queensland Lions Prima Book Club (QLPBC), said the five Lions behind the project had worked hard and were pleased to announce the May departure of the first delivery to Tonga of 4500

The OLPBC is a new club under Lions Club International as one of multiple specialty clubs in the com-

Ms Parkins said she was approached by a staff member at Benowa State School, near the Gold Coast who asked if the Lions could find recipients for thousands of books due to the school going digital.

"She said to me that the curriculum had changed, and I am a book lover and said we can't take the books to the books into cardboard boxes.

tip," she said. We made a lot of inquiries but couldn't give them to anybody in Australia because of the curriculum change, so we finally paired up with a company that is going to send them free of charge to Tonga and Fiji.

"Between the five of us, for the last three or four weeks, we've been madly packing up

"They've been picked up now and have gone to the shipping container which, hopefully, will be leaving before the end of the month."

Ms Parkins thanked the businesses and organisations that had assisted with the Australian leg of the project

but said that the book sale was a way for the Book Club to redeem costs from purchasing packing tape and cardboard boxes

"There are a lot of leftover novels, about 1500 in total and Redland City Council has given us the Victoria Point Hall free of charge," Ms Parkins said,

Ms Parkins said the project was a huge commitment for the Lions

There are still another 4500 down at the school which are earmarked for Fiji," she said.
"We are welcome to any

extra hands and volunteers for the next half and for future projects."

Ms Parkins said the organ isation is struggling to get member for the book club and are concentrating on services more than fundraising.




