



The Faculty Development Institute is designed to develop and expand the number of skilled lions' trainers who can then conduct training at Club, District and Multiple District levels. The curriculum is designed to enhance training delivery skills and training techniques to increase the quality of training and overall effectiveness of Lions leadership programmes.

Qualified candidates are those Lions who have some experience as instructors at local Lions training events, have demonstrated basic instructional skills, and have a keen interest in further developing those skills.

Lions participating in the FDI will be required to conduct a

local training event within six months of attending the institute, to complete the FDI.

The Lions Certified Instructor Program is designed to develop and expand the number of the most senior skilled Lions' trainers. Lions who complete the LCIP are eligible to serve as faculty at locally approved institutes (FDI & LCIP), as well as International FVDG/DGE Seminar and other training-related events conducted by LCI and from July 2020 it will be a requirement to have LCIP certification to be on faculty for these training programs.

There are several pathways into LCIP but this course covers Lions who have training experience but have not served as FVDG/DGE Seminar Group Leader or Lions Clubs International-directed institute faculty.

What do you know about Lions International Youth Exchange & Camps?

*The purpose of the Lions Youth Exchange Program
is to create and foster a spirit of understanding
among peoples of the world by:*

- bringing young people into contact with youth and adults of other countries;
- experiencing family and community life of another culture;

Lions International Youth Exchange & Camps

- promoting international understanding and goodwill throughout the world of Lionism.

In early July Lions International Youth Exchange welcomed into Australia 20 youth aged 15-20 years from Austria, Czech Republic, Estonia, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Hong Kong, Japan, Lithuania, Poland, Slovak, Spain, USA and Canada.

The exchange program ran from 6 July to 3 August 2024. Home hosting from 6-21 July and camps run from 21 July to 3 August.

TWO CAMPS WERE RUN:

Camp Kookaburra, N3 District for 10 youth aged 15 to under 18 years of age. This was a travelling camp to expose Lions and youth exchangees to The Entrance, Forster, Dunedoo, Mudgee and culminating in Sydney.

Camp Elim, a youth project of the Lions Club of Forster Tuncurry was for 10 youth 15-20 years of age. This was also a travelling camp. The first 8 days were spent in Forster at Camp Elim, then the camp travelled out to Lightning Ridge and culminated also in Sydney.

Both camps joining up in Sydney for a night and day. All youth flew home out of Sydney International Airport.

Applications are currently being taken for the outbound program. Popular destinations include North and South America, Europe, New Zealand, Japan and Malaysia. The summer program normally lasts for 4 to 6 weeks with the youth going out from November to January.

Gaining Publicity



A few suggestions re gaining publicity

There is often a divide between what the media believe is worthwhile promoting and what we supply to them.

Let me give you an example:

Many of our clubs raise funds through sausage sizzles, but we often miss the opportunity to turn the event into one the media will take notice of. The media and the public know Lions Clubs use these sizzles frequently in raising funds, so the event is normally not seen as being newsworthy regardless of the sum dollars being raised. So what could change their minds?

The media is likely more interested in knowing who the beneficiary is and may at times promote the sizzle in advance of it taking place as well as post the event. Consider the following:

Pre the Sizzle

- The beneficiary where possible should be a group or an individual that is likely to have public support. The more it pulls at the 'heart strings' the better.
- Where you can, go a step further and promote how the beneficiary will use the funds raised.
- Supply print media with photographic images of the beneficiary and better still images of member/s of your club with the beneficiary.
- The same imagery should be extended to your Social Media and your Club Website.
- If you have a radio station in your club area, be it Commercial, Community or a local or regional component of a national broadcaster supply as a

news item that includes the beneficiary and if known how the funds will be used. In your news item endeavour to have a quotation from the beneficiary and your club.

- Again where you can go a step further and try to negotiate an interview with your club and or the beneficiary.
- Some radio stations will broadcast 'advertisements' at no charge pre promoting your Sizzle. As a guide a 30 second advertisement should be no greater than 65 – 70 words

During the Sizzle

- Visual advertising promoting your club and the beneficiary (check with your sizzle site provider their requirements).
- Providing the sizzle site provider gives you a clearance take the opportunity to provide handout takeaways on behalf of your club and the beneficiary.
- Have a donation tin/box/bucket where sizzle customers can make donations to be given to your beneficiary.
- When appropriate use one or more representatives from your beneficiary to assist in staffing. Should they have beneficiary clothing encourage it to be worn.
- Take photographic images including Lions, customers of the sizzle and representatives of the beneficiary. **Important: Make certain you have the permission of all persons in each image before publishing.**

After the Sizzle

- Where you can take an appropriate image of your club representative/s making a presentation

of funds raised to the beneficiary and if appropriate image/s of how the beneficiary is using the funds.

- Publish the result along with images on your website and through your social media. Feel free to publish multiple images but ensure each image is accompanied by a suitable posted message so public members can easily identify who and what each image represents.
- Submit a news item to printed media along with photographic images. This may include quotations from your club and or the beneficiary.
- Submit a news item to your radio stations which again may include quotations from your club and the beneficiary.
- You may be able to achieve a radio interview involving your club and or the beneficiary.

Special Notations:

- (1) There is no expectation that clubs would use this concept for every sizzle event. It is understood many clubs will place the raised funds into the Community Service account from which at a later date disbursements will be made. When such disbursements are made again follow the shown dot points under **AFTER THE SIZZLE.**
- (2) While these suggestions relate to Sizzles you can use the same suggestions for your other fundraising projects.

OPERATION FRIENDSHIP IN DENMARK 2025

District Governor Ole Kjærsgård and the Lions family of District 106B, Denmark, extend an invitation to the Lions of District 201Q1 Australia, to visit our District in 2025 as part of the Operation Friendship program.

District 106B is one of the 3 Lions Districts in Denmark, which collectively make up Multiple District 106, which also includes the Faroe Islands and Greenland. The district has 112 Lions Clubs with about 2400 female and male Lions members.

From the applications received, one Lion, with his or her spouse, will be selected, to spend approximately 4 weeks, as guests of the Lions of District 106B. Other applications may be kept on file for future years. The visitors are expected to attend and address several Lions Clubs, and the District Convention which will be held Saturday April 26th. 2025. in the city Hinnerup. To enable this, the visit should be planned for the visitors to arrive on or about Saturday April 5th. 2025, and leave on or about Sunday May 4th.

During the one-month period, food at host family homes and accommodation will be provided by the Lions of District 106B. Every effort will be made that the interests of the visitors will be included in the leisure and sightseeing activities. An itinerary will be planned, so that the visitors will be hosted in various parts of District 106B, these having different environments.

The visitors must arrange and pay for all travel costs and travel insurance from Australia to Denmark and return, and during the stay. Lion 106B District will not be responsible for any medical and general expenses incurred during the stay.

A recent photo should be included within the application.

Typed applications to participate in Operation Friendship should be submitted to the address below and must be received by December 15th. 2024. The successful applicants will be advised by December 31th. 2024 which will allow adequate time for travel preparations.

Breathing Life into Service

Ask Fabrício Oliveira about his native Brazil, and he'll tell you it's the lungs of the world. An evergreen canopy rimmed in turquoise shoreline. He's from a small municipality there, the son of fabric merchants with entrepreneurial vigor in their blood.

By age 18, Fabrício was already part of the family business. He would focus on his studies during the week and travel dutifully for work over the weekends. For such a young man, Fabrício was driven and focused on results.

"I've always done things early," he recalls with a smile.

At just 22 years old, the spirited entrepreneur became a happily married man. He and his wife Amariles had both grown up in the village of Catolé do Rocha, where, despite the region's tropical climate, Fabrício Oliveira was proving to be a man for all seasons.

He was already having professional success—he had a number of business deals under his belt and more on the table. He was experiencing civic success—he had received several appointments to public office. Yet, something was missing for Fabrício.

Until one evening in 1985.

At the time, Fabrício and Amariles were part of a group of friends who would gather on weekends for different social events. Some of these friends were already Lions members and before long, they asked the Oliveiras to join their local club.

"We couldn't say no," he admits. "These were our close friends. And I saw something special in Lions, and an opportunity to give back to the community that had been so good to me."

It was a gesture as simple as an invitation that brought Fabrício Oliveira and his wife to Lions, once and for all.

"So I became a Lion. And that's how everything started," Fabrício recollects.


The call had been answered. A commitment to service set in motion. Now, it was time for the man from Catolé do Rocha to take what he'd learned so far from life and apply it to a new kind of work. His work as a Lion.
