## KEY POINTS FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING WHICH MIGHT BE OF INTEREST.

- GAT Council has approved the conduct of a GLT and GST District Coordinators workshop in August 2025.
- Member records: District Governors are requested to remind their Clubs, particularly the Club Secretaries, of the importance of having their Club member details correctly recorded in the Lion Portal as at 30 June 2025 Lions year. Advice of the number of Leos and Leo Clubs as at 30 June 2025 must still be provided.
- Scams and computer risks: District Governors are requested to communicate to their clubs the threats associated with computer and banking scams to ensure that Clubs put in place procedures to minimise the associated risks.

- Governor-Generals Patronage: Please note the confirmation of Her Excellency the Honourable Ms Sam Mostyn AC, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, as Patron of Lions Australia.
- Lions International Convention Florida: Lions in Constitutional Area 7 will participate in the usual functions at the Convention including the ANZI Reception. Registrants will shortly receive advice about volunteering opportunities for PID Tony Benbow's campaign to be elected as 3rd International Vice President. Registrations from CA7 are encouraged to join our delegation Facebook group at https://www.facebook.com/groups/CA7Anzi
- Licences to Seek funds: Licences were granted to Operation Smile and the Lions Prostate Cancer Research Treatment Project.
- Lions Green Canopy Project: The project was launched at the MD201 Convention in Traralgon.
- Leo Strategic Plan: The draft Leo Strategic plan was presented to Council. Council has allocated financial resources to bring the team together to develop the operational plans underpinning the strategy.
- All Districts are encouraged to view Multiple
  District vacancies and to share that information with
  suitable Lions, encouraging them to apply. The
  Multiple District has currently far too many vacant
  positions.

I was very happy this week to attend a presentation at the Macgregor State High School to celebrate the formation of our district's newest LEO club. The students were very enthusiastic and were well supported by the Brisbane Macgregor Lions club as well as the senior staff from the school. I anticipate great things coming out of this group of LEOs.

With new natural disasters occurring so frequently around our part of the world, I want to strongly encourage all clubs when they are looking at their financial distributions to please consider giving funds to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). They are the first to release funds into the area of natural disaster (Initial grant around \$US15,000) to help our communities get through the initial hardship of the event. Any money which you pay into LCIF will remain in Australia as the emergency grants, they make in Australia is far in excess of the donations which it receives, so your donation stays in Australia and never leaves our shore ready for the next natural disaster. Please encourage your club to support them in their efforts to quickly support our communities.

I am looking forward to catching up with you all at the District Change-Over as we celebrate this milestone in the Lions year. This event is both a celebration of all the hard work which has been done by the current cabinet members and a welcome and show of support to the incoming DG Stuart and his cabinet as they get ready to face the challenges of the next Lions year. So please make sure that your club organizes a group to attend.

## MY FDI JOURNEY — GROWING AS A LIONS TRAINER

Attending the **Faculty Development Institute (FDI)** was such a wonderful experience. Over three jam-

to 13 April 2025, I had the chance to connect with some truly inspiring Lions leaders from across Australia and New Zealand. I picked up heaps of practical training tips and gained a lot more confidence in my ability to communicate and lead.

We kicked things off with a warm, friendly welcome from the faculty and fellow participants. Right from the get-go, the energy in the room was positive, and there was a real sense of shared purpose. Our first session, "Introduction to Training," helped us unpack the difference between a presentation and a training session - something I'd never really stopped to think about before! We also had a great discussion about what makes an effective trainer, which really set the tone for the rest of the course.

The "Adult Learners" session was a real eye-opener. We talked about how adults learn differently and what keeps them motivated and engaged. Later that morning, we all gave a recorded short self-introduction for our first **Performance**Demonstration. It was definitely a little nervewracking, but also exciting as it was a great way to see where we were starting from.

In the afternoon, we jumped into **Training Preparation and Delivery Skills,** where we learned how to plan a session and build trust with our audience. Practising our voice, body language, and eye contact made such a difference - really practical stuff you could use straight away.

**Day 2** was all about putting our new skills to work. We had more demos, this time focusing on how to

kick off a training session properly, explain objectives, and bring people along for the journey. We then moved into **Interactive Learning** and explored ways to keep things engaging, give constructive feedback, and manage group activities effectively.

That afternoon, we looked at The **Training Environment** - how to create a welcoming and productive space for learning. It reminded me how even the smallest things - like room layout, lighting, temperature, or just the vibe you bring - can make a big difference.

By **Day 3,** everything started to click into place. We had to deliver a full recorded demo, presenting a topic we were given and running a short activity. My topic was **Public Speaking Skills,** which was a perfect fit. I had the chance to apply what we'd learned about the visual, vocal, and verbal elements of communication in a real training context. The group activities and engagement made it such a fun and valuable experience.

We wrapped up with a session called **"Making Use of Your Skills,"** which was all about how we can take everything we've learned back into our districts and clubs. We also talked about the Post-Institute

Assignment - delivering a local training session within six months. This step is essential if you're thinking of going on to the Lions Certified Instructor Program (LCIP) down the track.

The entire FDI experience was uplifting, energising, and filled with that unique Lions spirit. The faculty were supportive and approachable, and my fellow participants were so generous in sharing their knowledge and experiences.

I left FDI feeling more confident, capable, and excited about what's next. I'm really looking forward to stepping into future training opportunities and continuing to grow in my Lions journey. If you're a Lion who wants to build your leadership and make a bigger impact - I can't recommend FDI highly enough.

It is strongly suggested that, if you wish to purchase products for Christmas in July that you place your orders as early as possible. I have attached the link to the cake order form for your convenience.



Paula Davoren who passed in 2019 was a life member of Lions International and a long term member (23 years) of the Brisbane Macgregor Lions Club. Paula was the club's first female president (2002 – 2003) and additionally she served on District Cabinet for many years as Minute Secretary.

Through Belinda, her daughter, funds were made available for the Paula Davoren Bursary.

Year 6 students at Macgregor State School who intend to enrol in Year 7 at Macgregor State High School nominate to be considered for the bursary and if successful the bursary provides:

When in Year 7 \$2,000 and then in Years 8, 9 and 10 a further \$1,000 each year.

Through her involvement with Lions, Paula Davoren led many initiatives to improve the lives of others. One project that she was particularly passionate about was Lions Recycle for Sight where she implemented programs to collect, test, clean, sort and distribute second hand eyeglasses to people in need around the world. This work embodied Paula's compassion, integrity and commitment to helping others.

As part of the application process for the Paula Davoren Bursary Award, all applicants are asked to provide a two-minute video response to the following question:

How do you live the values of compassion, integrity and commitment in your own life? In your response, provide an example of how demonstrating this has improved the life of someone else.

The Bursary has led to a very strong association with the Macgregor Schools covering several project initiatives including the establishment of a Macgregor State High School Leo Club with a foundation of 25 students which is likely to grow well beyond.

Paula while serving as a Brisbane Macgregor Lion advocated for the establishment of a Leo Club at the school.

The Gold Coast can be reached by international and domestic air travel into two airports:

Gold Coast Airport (OOL) is 31km from the venue and services domestic and international arrivals

Brisbane Airport (BNE) is 80 km from the venue and services domestic and international arrivals

#### By an UBER or a Taxi:

From Gold Coast Airport, Coolangatta (OOL) to Mantra on View Surfers Paradise UBER approximately \$55 - \$85 or a TAXI approximately \$65 - \$90 and takes 35 minutes

From Brisbane Airport (BNE) to Mantra on View Surfers Paradise
UBER approximately \$120 - \$180 or a TAXI approximately \$150- \$220 and takes 85 minutes

#### By Bus and Tram

The Queensland Government has introduced a 50 cent flat rate which applies across all zones and modes on the Translink network across Queensland. This includes all regional urban buses, and bus, train, ferry, tram and on demand services in South East Queensland. It does not include the Airtrain.

Fares can be paid by Go Card or Contactless Payment via your phone or device. **Simply tap on and tap off each time.** Further information on payment, costs and the journey planner can be found on translink.com.au and the translink app.

#### From Gold Coast Airport, Coolangatta (OOL) to Mantra on View Surfers Paradise

Walk to the Bus from Airport (687m) - Travel by bus to Broadbeach South Station - Walk (75m) to G Link Tram - Travel by Tram to Cypress Avenue Station, Surfers Paradise - Walk (183m) to Mantra on View Hotel. **Cost \$0.50c** 

#### From Brisbane Airport (BNE) to Mantra on View Surfers Paradise

Travel from airport by train to Nerang Station- Walk (36m) to Bus - Travel by Bus to Cypress Avenue Station, Surfers Paradise - Walk (73m) to Mantra on View Hotel. **Cost \$23.20**
